096010460 **HOUSE BILL NO. 2314** 1 2 3 4 5 6 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the House Committee on Militia, Police and Public Safety on January 30, 2009) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Carrico) A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 52-6.2, relating to the State Police 7 Volunteer Chaplaincy Program. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 9 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 52-6.2 as follows: 10 § 52-6.2. Volunteer Chaplaincy Program. The Superintendent of State Police shall have the authority to establish a Volunteer Chaplaincy 11 Program, enabling employees of the Department otherwise trained in ministry to serve as volunteer 12 chaplains, without supplemental compensation. Duties of the volunteer chaplains shall be established by 13 order of the Superintendent and may include, but are not limited to, providing employees of the 14 15 Department and their families with spiritual counseling and guidance, and providing invocations and 16 benedictions at Department-sanctioned events and ceremonies. The Superintendent may establish guidelines regarding the selection and general supervision of the volunteer chaplains in the Volunteer 17 Chaplaincy Program; however, the activities and services of each volunteer chaplain shall be provided 18 in his individual capacity and in accordance with the dictates of his own conscience. Neither the 19 20 Department, the Superintendent, nor any other Department official shall prescribe, proscribe, regulate, limit, or otherwise dictate the religious content of the volunteer chaplains' expression of religious beliefs, prayers, invocations, benedictions, spiritual counseling, or spiritual guidance. Anytime a 21 22 volunteer chaplain is called upon to provide an invocation or benediction for the purpose of solemnizing 23 24 a Department-sanctioned event or ceremony, and a printed agenda or program is distributed at such 25 event or ceremony, a disclaimer shall be included on the agenda or program to acknowledge that the 26 invocation or benediction is the voluntary offering of an individual, and that the views or beliefs 27 expressed by such individual have not been previously reviewed, approved, sanctioned, or endorsed by

28 *the Department.*
