4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 36-98.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Department of General
5	Services; Uniform Statewide Building Code; buildings and structures owned by the state or located
6	on state property.

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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 36-98.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
13	§ 36-98.1. State buildings; exception for certain assets owned by the Department of Transportation.
14	A. The Building Code shall be applicable to all state-owned buildings and structures and buildings
15	and structures built on state-owned property, with the exception that §§ 2.2-1159 through 2.2-1161 shall
16	provide the standards for ready access to and use of state-owned buildings by the physically
17	handicapped.
18	Any state-owned building or structure and all buildings and structures built on state-owned property
19 20	for which preliminary plans were prepared or on which construction commenced after the initial effective date of the Uniform Statewide Building Code, shall remain subject to the provisions of the
20 21	Uniform Statewide Building Code that were in effect at the time such plans were completed or such
22	construction commenced. Subsequent reconstruction, renovation or demolition of such building or
23	structure shall be subject to the pertinent provisions of the Building Code.
24	Acting through the Division of Engineering and Buildings, the Department of General Services shall
25	function as the building official for state-owned buildings and buildings and structures built on
26	state-owned property. The Department shall review and approve plans and specifications, grant
27	modifications, and establish such rules and regulations as may be necessary to implement this section. It
28	shall may provide for the inspection of state-owned buildings and buildings and structures built on
29	state-owned property and enforcement of the Building Code and standards for access by the physically
30	handicapped by delegating inspection and Building Code enforcement duties to the State Fire Marshal's
31	Office, to other appropriate state agencies having needed expertise, and to local building departments, all
32	of which shall provide such assistance within a reasonable time and in the manner requested. State
33	agencies and institutions occupying buildings shall pay to the local building department the same fees as
34	would be paid by a private citizen for the services rendered when such services are requested by the
35	Department of General Services. The Department of General Services may alter or overrule any decision
36 37	of the local building department after having first considered the local building department's report or
37 38	other rationale given for its decision. When altering or overruling any decision of a local building department, the Department of General Services shall provide the local building department with a
39	written summary of its reasons for doing so.
<b>40</b>	B. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A and § 27-99, roadway tunnels and bridges owned
41	by the Department of Transportation shall be exempt from the Building Code and the Statewide Fire
42	Prevention Code Act (§ 27-94 et seq.). The Department of General Services shall not have jurisdiction
43	over such roadway tunnels, bridges, and other limited access highways; provided, however, that the
44	Department of General Services shall have jurisdiction over any occupied buildings within any
45	Department of Transportation rights-of-way that are subject to the Building Code.
46	Roadway tunnels and bridges shall be designed, constructed, and operated to comply with fire safety
47	standards based on nationally recognized model codes and standards to be developed by the Department
<b>48</b>	of Transportation in consultation with the State Fire Marshal and approved by the Commonwealth
49	Transportation Board. Emergency response planning and activities related to the standards approved by
50	the Commonwealth Transportation Board shall be developed by the Department of Transportation and
51	coordinated with the appropriate local officials and emergency services providers. On an annual basis the
52	Department of Transportation shall provide a report on the maintenance and operability of installed fire
53	protection and detection systems in roadway tunnels and bridges to the State Fire Marshal.
54	C. Except as provided in subsection D of § 23-38.109, and notwithstanding the provisions of
55	subsection A, at the request of a public institution of higher education, the Department, as further set

forth in this subsection, shall authorize that institution of higher education, the Department, as fulfiller set
forth in this subsection, shall authorize that institution of higher education to contract with a building
official of the locality in which the construction is taking place to perform any inspection and
certifications required for the purpose of complying with the Uniform Statewide Building Code (§ 36-97)

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- et seq.). The Department shall publish administrative procedures that shall be followed in contracting with a building official of the locality. The authority granted to a public institution of higher education under this subsection to contract with a building official of the locality shall be subject to the institution meeting the conditions prescribed in subsection B of § 23-38.88. 60 61
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
