6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 18.2-460 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

8 § 18.2-460. Obstructing justice; penalty.

9 A. If any person without just cause knowingly obstructs a judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney
10 for the Commonwealth, witness ~~or~~, any law-enforcement officer, *or animal control officer employed*
11 *pursuant to § 3.2-6555* in the performance of his duties as such or fails or refuses without just cause to
12 cease such obstruction when requested to do so by such judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the
13 Commonwealth, witness, ~~or~~ law-enforcement officer, *or animal control officer employed pursuant to*
14 *§ 3.2-6555*, he shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

15 B. Except as provided in subsection C, any person who, by threats or force, knowingly attempts to
16 intimidate or impede a judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the Commonwealth, witness, ~~or~~ any
17 law-enforcement officer, *or an animal control officer employed pursuant to § 3.2-6555* lawfully engaged
18 in his duties as such, or to obstruct or impede the administration of justice in any court, is guilty of a
19 Class 1 misdemeanor.

20 C. If any person by threats of bodily harm or force knowingly attempts to intimidate or impede a
21 judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the Commonwealth, witness, any law-enforcement officer,
22 lawfully engaged in the discharge of his duty, or to obstruct or impede the administration of justice in
23 any court relating to a violation of or conspiracy to violate § 18.2-248 or subdivision (a) (3), (b) or (c)
24 of § 18.2-248.1, or § 18.2-46.2 or § 18.2-46.3, or relating to the violation of or conspiracy to violate any
25 violent felony offense listed in subsection C of § 17.1-805, he shall be guilty of a Class 5 felony.

26 D. Any person who knowingly and willfully makes any materially false statement or representation
27 to a law-enforcement officer *or an animal control officer employed pursuant to § 3.2-6555* who is in the
28 course of conducting an investigation of a crime by another is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
