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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 62.1-132.20 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Craney Island Disposal 3 Area.

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## Approved

## Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

7 1. That § 62.1-132.20 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 62.1-132.20. Craney Island Disposal Årea.

9 A. No agency of the Commonwealth, including the Virginia Port Authority, shall have the authority 10 to expand the Craney Island Disposal Area northward or westward or beyond its present capacity or to cause activities which will result in such expansion of the Craney Island Disposal Area. In addition, no 11 12 state funds shall be expended for any activities which will result in the expansion of Craney Island 13 northward or westward or beyond its present capacity as a disposal area for material dredged from any site, including the Hampton Roads Harbor. However, the Commonwealth and the Virginia Port 14 15 Authority are authorized to expend state funds for a feasibility study and an environmental impact study related to the potential expansion of Craney Island to the east for an additional marine terminal. 16

B. The Virginia Port Authority is hereby directed, in coordination with other state and federal 17 18 agencies, including the United States Army Corps of Engineers, to locate, establish, and use ocean 19 disposal areas for ocean-suitable dredge materials from the Hampton Roads Harbor, or some other suitable site, and to use the existing Craney Island Disposal Area for dredge material suitable or 20 unsuitable for alternate disposal, including ocean disposal, with priority given to materials dredged from 21 the Southern Branch of the Elizabeth River. An additional marine terminal may, with the consent of the 22 23 General Assembly and the Governor, be constructed on the eastern side of Craney Island if studies show 24 that it is in the public interest to use dredge material to develop such a facility The construction of a 25 marine terminal on the eastern side of Craney Island Disposal Area using dredge material to extend the 26 disposal area eastward, as defined in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Feasibility Study approved on 27 October 24, 2006, and authorized by Congress in the Water Resources Development Act of 2007, is 28 *hereby authorized.* 

29 C. Prior to the disposal of any dredged material either at an ocean area or on the Craney Island 30 Disposal Area, after the Craney Island Disposal Area has attained its capacity limit, the appropriate state 31 agencies shall investigate and consider the cost and availability of beneficial uses of the dredged material. The appropriate state agencies shall consult with state and federal agencies to ensure the 32 33 environmental acceptability of any beneficial use. When such environmentally acceptable beneficial use 34 is available and economically feasible, the appropriate state agencies shall pursue such use.

35 For purposes of this section, "Craney Island Disposal Area" means that parcel of land lying and being in the body of water known as Hampton Roads Harbor, within the City of Portsmouth and 36 37 adjacent to the City of Suffolk.

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
