2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 15.2 a chapter numbered 24.2, consisting of 3 sections numbered 15.2-2419 through 15.2-2429, relating to creation of the Virginia Broadband 4 Infrastructure Loan Fund.

7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 15.2 a chapter numbered 24.2, 9 consisting of sections numbered 15.2-2419 through 15.2-2429, as follows:

10 § 15.2-2419. Definitions.

11 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:

12 "Authority" means the Virginia Resources Authority created in Chapter 21 (§ 62.1-197 et seq.) of 13 Title 62.1.

14 "Cost," as applied to any project financed under the provisions of this chapter, means the total of all 15 costs incurred by the local government as reasonable and necessary for carrying out all works and undertakings necessary or incident to the accomplishment of any project. 16 17

"Fund" means the Virginia Broadband Infrastructure Loan Fund.

18 "Local government" means any county, city, town, municipal corporation, authority, district, 19 commission, or political subdivision created by the General Assembly or pursuant to the Constitution or 20 laws of the Commonwealth.

21 "Project" means any undertaking by a local government to build or facilitate the building of 22 broadband infrastructure, including wireless broadband infrastructure which will provide broadband 23 services only to areas within the Commonwealth which are currently unserved by broadband services. 24

§ 15.2-2420. Creation and management of Fund.

25 There shall be set apart as a permanent and perpetual fund, to be known as the Virginia Broadband 26 Infrastructure Loan Fund, consisting of such sums that may be appropriated to the Fund by the General 27 Assembly, all receipts by the Fund from loans made by it to local governments, all income from the investment of moneys held in the Fund, and any other sums designated for deposit to the Fund from any 28 29 source public or private. The Fund shall be administered and managed by the Authority as prescribed 30 in this chapter. The Authority shall establish guidelines regarding the distribution of loans or grants 31 from the Fund, prioritization of such loans and grants, and shall establish interest rates and repayment 32 terms of such loans as provided in this chapter. The Authority may disperse from the Fund its 33 reasonable costs and expenses incurred in the administration and management of the Fund. 34

§ 15.2-2421. Deposit of money; expenditures; investments.

35 All money belonging to the Fund shall be deposited in an account or accounts in banks or trust 36 companies organized under the laws of the Commonwealth or in national banking associations located 37 in Virginia or in savings institutions located in Virginia organized under the laws of the Commonwealth 38 or the United States. The money in these accounts shall be paid by check signed by the Executive 39 Director of the Authority or other officers or employees designated by the Board of Directors of the 40 Authority. All deposits of money shall, if required by the Authority, be secured in a manner determined 41 by the Authority to be prudent, and all banks, trust companies, and savings institutions are authorized to 42 give security for the deposits. Money in the Fund shall not be comingled with other money of the 43 Authority. Money in the Fund not needed for immediate use or disbursement may be invested or 44 reinvested by the Authority in obligations or securities that are considered lawful investments for public 45 funds under the laws of the Commonwealth.

§ 15.2-2422. Annual audit. 46

47 The Auditor of Public Accounts, or his legally authorized representatives, shall annually audit the 48 accounts of the Authority, and the cost of such audit services as shall be required shall be borne by the 49 Authority. The audit shall be performed at least each fiscal year, in accordance with generally accepted 50 auditing standards and, accordingly, include such tests of the accounting records and such auditing 51 procedures as are considered necessary under the circumstances. The Authority shall furnish copies of such audit to the Governor. 52

53 § 15.2-2423. Collection of money due Fund.

54 The Authority is empowered to collect, or to authorize others to collect on its behalf, amounts due to 55 the Fund under any loan to a local government, including, if appropriate, taking the action required by 56 § 15.2-2659 to obtain payment of any amounts in default. Proceedings to recover amounts due to the

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57 Fund may be instituted by the Authority in the name of the Fund in the appropriate circuit court. 58 § 15.2-2424. Loans to local governments.

59 Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, money in the Fund shall be used solely to make loans 60 to local governments to finance or refinance the cost of any project. No loan from the Fund shall 61 exceed the total cost of the project to be financed or the outstanding principal amount of indebtedness 62 to be refinanced plus reasonable financing expenses.

The Authority shall determine the terms and conditions of any loan from the Fund, which may vary 63 64 between local governments. Each loan shall be evidenced by appropriate bonds or notes of the local 65 government payable to the Fund. The bonds or notes shall have been duly authorized by the local 66 government and executed by its authorized legal representatives. The Authority is authorized to require 67 in connection with any loan from the Fund such documents, instruments, certificates, legal opinions, and 68 other information as it may deem necessary or convenient. In addition to any other terms or conditions 69 which the Authority may establish, the Authority may require, as a condition to making any loan from 70 the Fund, that the local government receiving the loan covenant perform any of the following:

1. Establish and collect rents, rates, fees, and charges to produce revenue sufficient to pay all or a 71 72 specified portion of (i) the costs of operation, maintenance, replacement, renewal, and repairs of the 73 project; (ii) any outstanding indebtedness incurred for the purposes of the project, including the 74 principal and premium, if any, and interest on the loan from the Fund to the local government; and (iii) 75 any amounts necessary to create and maintain any required reserve, including any rate stabilization 76 fund deemed necessary or appropriate by the Authority to offset the need, in whole or in part, for future 77 increases in rents, rates, fees, or charges;

78 2. Levy and collect ad valorem taxes on all property within the jurisdiction of the local government 79 subject to local taxation sufficient to pay the principal and premium, if any, and interest on the loan 80 from the Fund to the local government;

3. Create and maintain a special fund or funds for the payment of the principal and premium, if any, 81 and interest on the loan from the Fund to the local government and any other amounts becoming due 82 83 under any agreement entered into in connection with the loan, or for the operation, maintenance, repair, 84 or replacement of the project or any portions thereof or other property of the local government, and 85 deposit into any fund or funds amounts sufficient to make any payments on the loan as they become due 86 and payable; 87

4. Create and maintain other special funds as required by the Authority; and

88 5. Perform other acts, including the conveyance of, or the granting of liens on or security interests 89 in, real and personal property, together with all rights, title and interest therein, to the Fund, or to take 90 other actions as may be deemed necessary or desirable by the Authority to secure payment of the 91 principal and premium, if any, and interest on the loan from the Fund to the local government and to 92 provide for the remedies of the Fund in the event of any default by the local government in the payment 93 of the loan, including, without limitation, any of the following:

94 a. The procurement of insurance, guarantees, letters of credit, and other forms of collateral, security, 95 liquidity arrangements or credit supports for the loan from any source, public or private, and the 96 payment therefor of premiums, fees, or other charges;

97 b. The combination of one or more projects, or the combination of one or more projects with one or 98 more other undertakings, facilities, utilities, or systems, for the purpose of operations and financing, and 99 the pledging of the revenues from such combined projects, undertakings, facilities, utilities, and systems 100 to secure the loan from the Fund to the local government made in connection with such combination or 101 any part or parts thereof; 102

c. The maintenance, replacement, renewal, and repair of the project; and

d. The procurement of casualty and liability insurance.

104 All local governments borrowing money from the Fund are authorized to perform any acts, take any 105 action, adopt any proceedings, and make and carry out any contracts that are contemplated by this chapter. Such contracts need not be identical among all local governments, but may be structured as 106 107 determined by the Authority according to the needs of the contracting local governments and the Fund.

108 Subject to the rights, if any, of the registered owners of any of the bonds of the Authority, the 109 Authority may consent to and approve any modification in the terms of any loan to any local 110 government subject to the guidelines adopted by the Board. 111

§ 15.2-2425. Prioritization of loans.

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In approving loans, the Authority shall give preference to loans for projects that will (i) utilize 112 113 private industry in the operation and maintenance of such projects where a material savings in cost can 114 be shown over public operation and maintenance, (ii) serve two or more local governments to encourage regional cooperation, or (iii) provide broadband services in areas with a demonstrated need 115 that, in the opinion of the Secretary of Technology and the Secretary of Economic Development, are 116 currently unserved by broadband providers. 117

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118 § 15.2-2426. Pledge of loans to secure bonds of Authority.

119 The Authority is empowered at any time and from time to time to transfer from the Fund to banks or 120 trust companies designated by the Authority any or all assets of the Fund to be held in trust as security 121 for the payment of the principal and premium, if any, and interest on any or all of the bonds (as defined 122 in § 62.1-199) of the Authority. The interests of the Fund in any obligations so transferred shall be 123 subordinate to the rights of the trustee under the pledge. To the extent funds are not available from 124 other sources pledged for such purpose, any payments of principal and interest received on the assets 125 transferred or held in trust may be applied by the trustee thereof to the payment of the principal and 126 premium, if any, and interest on such bonds of the Authority to which the obligations have been 127 pledged, and, if such payments are insufficient for such purpose, the trustee is empowered to sell any or 128 all of such assets and apply the net proceeds from the sale to the payment of the principal and 129 premium, if any, and interest on such bonds of the Authority. Any assets of the Fund transferred in trust 130 as set forth above and any payments of principal, interest, or earnings received thereon shall remain 131 part of the Fund but shall be subject to the pledge to secure the bonds of the Authority and shall be 132 held by the trustee to which they are pledged until no longer required for such purpose by the terms of 133 the pledge. On or before January 10 each year, the Authority shall transfer, or shall cause the trustee to 134 transfer, to the Fund any assets transferred or held in trust as set forth above that are no longer 135 required to be held in trust pursuant to the terms of the pledge.

136 § 15.2-2427. Sale of loans.

137 The Authority is empowered at any time and from time to time to sell, upon such terms and
138 conditions as the Authority shall deem appropriate, any loan, or interest therein, made pursuant to this
139 chapter. The net proceeds of sale remaining after payment of the costs and expenses of the sale shall be
140 designated for deposit to, and become part of, the Fund.

141 § 15.2-2428. Powers of the Authority.

142 The Authority is authorized to do any act necessary or convenient to the exercise of the powers **143** granted in this chapter or reasonably implied thereby.

144 § 15.2-2429. Liberal construction of chapter.

145 The provisions of this chapter shall be liberally construed to the end that its beneficial purposes may **146** be effectuated. Insofar as the provisions of this chapter are inconsistent with the provisions of any other

147 law, general, special, or local, the provisions of this chapter shall be controlling.
