4 5	Requesting the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia to study the feasibility of establishing a four-year degree-granting institution of higher education in the City of Virginia Beach. Report.

9 10	WHEREAS, the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, created pursuant to Chapter 1.1 of
11	Title 23, is charged with serving as the coordinating agency for the public institutions of higher
12	education in Virginia; and
13	WHEREAS, among the Council's duties and responsibilities is the biennial preparation of plans
14	concerning public undergraduate and graduate education, including the location of all public educational
15 16	where the weight of the weight of the terms of terms of the terms of terms
17	Commonwealth and its citizens; and
18	WHEREAS, institutions of higher education serve the dual role of educating students and anchoring
19	economic development in the communities where they are located; and
20 21	WHEREAS, in September 2007, the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia issued revised enrollment projections suggesting that between Fall 2006 and Fall 2013, in-state enrollment demand at
$\frac{21}{22}$	public colleges and universities will increase by 42,436 students; and
$\overline{23}$	WHEREAS, the City of Virginia Beach is currently the 42nd largest city in the United States and the
24	most populous in the Commonwealth with approximately 440,000 citizens according to the United States
25 26	Census Bureau estimate; and WHEREAS, a four-year institution could advance the City's goal of becoming a community for a
20 27	lifetime and ensure that fewer students leave Virginia Beach after high school; and
28	WHEREAS, though the City of Virginia Beach is served by the Virginia Community College
29	System, there is no comprehensive four-year institution or branch campus that can be easily accessed by
30 31	the citizens in the area; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the State Council of Higher
32	Education for Virginia be requested to study the feasibility of establishing a four-year degree-granting
33	institution of higher education in the City of Virginia Beach.
34	In conducting its study, the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia shall (i) review the
35 36	policies and procedures, if any, for the establishment of colleges, branch campuses, and regional higher education centers in the Commonwealth, including accreditation; (ii) analyze the availability of
37	appropriate facilities, space, and grounds for enhanced higher education services in the City of Virginia
38	Beach; (iii) analyze the availability of qualified professors, instructors, administrators, and staff in the
39	City of Virginia Beach and surrounding areas; (iv) determine the interest of the College of William and
40 41	Mary, George Mason University, Norfolk State University, Old Dominion University, the University of Virginia, Virginia Commonwealth University, and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in
42	establishing a branch campus in the City of Virginia Beach; (v) consult with public and private colleges
43	and universities currently serving the City of Virginia Beach; and (vi) consider such other issues as may
44	be deemed necessary by the joint subcommittee.
45 46	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia for this study, upon request.
40 47	The State Council of Higher Education for Virginia shall complete its meetings by November 30,
48	2009, and shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report
49	of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive
50 51	summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative
51 52	Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2010 Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's
53	website.

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
