## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 691**

Offered January 14, 2009 Prefiled January 13, 2009

Celebrating the life of Robert Edward Shepherd, Jr.

Patron—Peace, Janis, Loupassi, and O'Bannon

WHEREAS, Robert Edward Shepherd, Jr., a respected law professor and national leader and advocate for legal issues concerning children and families for over 30 years, died on December 11, 2008; and

10 WHEREAS, a Richmond native, Robert Shepherd was the son of the late Robert E. Shepherd, Sr.; he 11 earned a bachelor's degree and law degree from Washington and Lee University; and

12 WHEREAS, the Washington and Lee Law Review published an article by Robert Shepherd in 13 support of a law that would hold parents financially responsible for any child born to them out of 14 wedlock; his brief became the foundation of Virginia's first statute on child abuse, setting the future 15 course of his career; and

WHEREAS, after serving his country in the United States Army Judge Advocate General's Corps,Robert Shepherd began the private practice of law in Richmond; and

18 WHERÉAS, in 1971 Robert Shepherd joined the Virginia Attorney General's Office, where he
19 represented the Division of Youth Services, now the Department of Juvenile Justice; he was the major
20 architect of the 1977 revision of the state juvenile code and statutes on special education and child abuse
21 and neglect; and

WHEREAS, Robert Shepherd began teaching law at the University of Richmond in 1978, where he was a revered professor and mentor to aspiring young lawyers until his retirement in 2001; and

WHEREAS, an expert in legal issues affecting children and families, Robert Shepherd influenced all
of juvenile justice legislation in Virginia for three decades, and, in 1999, was the first person inducted
into the Virginia Juvenile Court Hall of Fame; and

27 WHEREAS, Robert Shepherd recently served as a visiting professor at his alma mater, and he was admired as "one of the last of a generation of legal giants in Virginia" by his students and colleagues;

30 WHEREAS, Robert Shepherd was a founder of the University of Richmond's National Center for

WHEREAS, Robert Shepherd was a founder of the University of Richmond's National Center forFamily Law and a member of its board; and

WHEREAS, over the years, Robert Shepherd generously gave his time and expertise to many
 organizations, including as a board member of the Action Alliance for Virginia's Children and Youth, as
 well as chairing both the American Bar Association's Juvenile Justice Committee and the Virginia Bar
 Association's Committee on the Needs of Children; and

WHEREAS, throughout his distinguished career, Robert Shepherd received numerous awards and
 accolades, including the University of Richmond's Distinguished Educator Award and the Child
 Advocacy Award of the National Association of Counsel for Children; and

WHEREAS, Robert Shepherd was a faithful member of River Road Church, Baptist, where he taughtSunday school for 36 years and was active in the church's many missions in the community; and

WHEREAS, a devoted family man and loyal friend, Robert Shepherd will be fondly remembered and
greatly missed by his wife, Nancy Baker Shepherd; his son Robert III; his two daughters, Sharon and
Stephanie; his two stepdaughters, Kara and Courtney; his mother, Mildred Shepherd; his five
grandchildren; and many other loving family members and friends; now, therefore, be it
