| 10         | WHEREAS, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 was founded on four principles: inclusion,  |
| 11         | full participation, economic self-sufficiency, and equality of opportunity for all people with disabilities;   |
| 12         | and  |
| 13         | WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Department of Commerce Bureau of the Census, disabilities affect  |
| 14         | one-fifth of all Americans, 1 in 10 have a severe disability, and the growth in the number of people   |
| 15         | with disabilities is expected to accelerate in the coming decades due to the aging of the population; and  |
| 16<br>17   | WHEREAS, the Bureau also reports that about 9 million people of all ages have disabilities so severe that they require personal assistance to perform everyday activities, and about 80 percent of |
| 18         | primary caregivers are relatives, and nearly half of the primary caregivers live with the person with a  |
| 19         | disability; and  |
| 20         | WHEREAS, the Center for Personal Assistance Services estimated in 2005 that "962,000 people in   |
| 21         | Virginia have a disability, or 14.1 percent of the population age 5 and over," and that "an estimated  |
| 22         | 172,000 people, or 2.5 percent of the population age 5 and over, have difficulty performing self-care  |
| 23         | activities commonly referred to as Activities of Daily Living, such as dressing, bathing, or getting   |
| 24<br>25   | around inside the home"; and<br>WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Education's 2006 Child Count reported that Virginia served   |
| 23<br>26   | 172,704 students with disabilities under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act; and  |
| 27         | WHEREAS, research has shown that students with disabilities encounter more difficulty being  |
| 28         | accepted by their peers, making friends, and becoming involved in school and community-based   |
| 29         | activities and clubs than nondisabled students; and  |
| 30         | WHEREAS, to ensure the full inclusion of people with disabilities into society, it is necessary to   |
| 31<br>32   | increase public awareness, knowledge, and understanding of disabilities, the etiology of disabilities, and   |
| 32<br>33   | the rights of disabled persons; and<br>WHEREAS, October is recognized as National Disability Employment Awareness Month by the U.S.  |
| 33<br>34   | Department of Labor and as National Disability Awareness Month by the U.S. Department of Health  |
| 35         | and Human Services Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; and   |
| 36         | WHEREAS, designating October as Disability History and Awareness Month in Virginia will  |
| 37         | increase public awareness and respect for persons with disabilities, inform the public concerning their  |
| 38         | many contributions to society, encourage health promotion to increase community awareness of the   |
| 39<br>40   | needs of persons with disabilities, and emphasize the abilities and rights of disabled persons rather than   |
| 40<br>41   | their exceptionalities; now, therefore, be it<br>RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate  |
| 42         | the month of October, in 2009 and in each succeeding year, as Disability History and Awareness Month   |
| 43         | in Virginia; and, be it  |
| 44         | RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Governor be requested to encourage the people of the  |
| 45         | Commonwealth, including public schools, institutions of higher education, the business and corporate   |
| 46         | community, civic and advocacy organizations, the faith community, and other interested entities, through   |
| 47<br>48   | education and other appropriate activities, programs, and events to promote and highlight Disability<br>History and Awareness Month in Virginia; and, be it  |
| 40<br>49   | RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution  |
| <b>5</b> 0 | to Lisbet Ward, Chairwoman of the Virginia Board for People with Disabilities, requesting that she   |
| 51         | further disseminate copies of this resolution to the Youth Leadership Forum of Virginia so that their  |
| 52         | members may be apprised of the sense of the General Assembly of Virginia in this matter; and, be it  |
