13 14	Chancellor in Great Britain and the leader of the Conservative (Tory) Party; and WHEREAS, Lyndhurst Station in Lyndhurst served as an integral part of the Shenandoah Valley	Ħ
15	Railroad system after the Civil War; and	Н
16	WHEREAS, the Lyndhurst Station depot, still in excellent condition, is one of the remaining extant	U
17	railroad stations in Virginia; and	
18	WHEREAS, Lyndhurst Station and the community of Lyndhurst are directly connected with the	
19	Shenandoah Railroad and the station is privately owned although Norfolk Southern owns the land; and	
20	WHEREAS, thirteen years after the station was built, worship services were held for the newly	
21	formed Lyndhurst Methodist Church, and the station has served previously as the local post office and is	
22	the main identifying building of the community of Lyndhurst; and	
23	WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate to recognize Lyndhurst Station for its historic place in	HJ722
