6	Commending Lyndhurst Station for its distinctive and historic place in Virginia history.
7	WHEREAS, Lyndhurst Station was built on June 19, 1862, as a combined passenger and freight
8	station; and
9	WHEREAS, Lyndhurst Station and the Lyndhurst community were named by George C. Milne, an
10	executive of Shenandoah Valley railroad, to honor Lord Lyndhurst, a native of Boston, who was Lord
11	Chancellor in Great Britain and the leader of the Conservative (Tory) Party; and
12	WHEREAS, Lyndhurst Station in Lyndhurst served as an integral part of the Shenandoah Valley
13	Railroad system after the Civil War; and
14	WHEREAS, the Lyndhurst Station depot, still in excellent condition, is one of the remaining extant
15	railroad stations in Virginia; and
16	WHEREAS, Lyndhurst Station and the community of Lyndhurst are directly connected with the
17	Shenandoah Railroad, and the station is privately owned, although Norfolk Southern owns the land; and
18	WHEREAS, thirteen years after the station was built, worship services were held for the newly
19	formed Lyndhurst Methodist Church, and the station has served previously as the local post office and is
20	the main identifying building of the community of Lyndhurst; and
21	WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate to recognize Lyndhurst Station for its historic place in
22	Virginia's history; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly
24	commend Lyndhurst Station for its distinctive and historic place in Virginia history; and, be it
25	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
26	for presentation to Nancy Taylor Sorrells, chairwoman of the Augusta County Board of Supervisors as
27	an expression of the General Assembly's admiration for Lyndhurst Station's unique contributions to the
28	Commonwealth.
