3	Creating the Commission on Virginia's Transportation Needs. Report.

5 6	Unanimous consent to introduce
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8	Referred to Committee on Rules
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10	WHEREAS, a comprehensive transportation network is essential to continued economic growth and
11	prosperity in the Commonwealth; and
12	WHEREAS, it has long been the goal of the General Assembly that transportation needs be assessed
13 14	objectively and scientifically, both for the present and into the future; and WHEREAS, there is a need to confirm the critical highway and transportation needs of the
14	Commonwealth, and explore alternative means of financing transportation; and
16	WHEREAS, the federal Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: a Legacy
17	for Users (SAFETEA-LU) will expire at the end of the current federal fiscal year and a new federal
18	transportation authorization will be under consideration; and
19	WHEREAS, the improvement of the state's transportation infrastructure is dependent upon sustainable
20 21	sources of revenue and the strengthening of jurisdictional and agency cooperation; and
²¹ 22	WHEREAS, new funding authorities and mechanisms, such as state and regional bonds, lines of credit, public-private partnerships, and private facilities, have made significant transportation
$\frac{22}{23}$	improvements possible in the last decade and provide models to develop additional nontraditional
24	funding mechanisms; and
25	WHEREAS, in addition to new construction needs, bridge rehabilitation and replacement, pavement
26	repair and transit capital equipment purchase and replacement must be assessed; and
27	WHEREAS, public transportation is an essential and growing component of the transportation
28 29	system; and federal energy policies require an expanded role for public transportation; and WHEREAS, public transportation should be studied on a regional basis with a view to determine
30	whether regional transportation district commissions should be created in certain areas of the
31	Commonwealth; and
32	WHEREAS, it is essential that Virginia have a comprehensive transportation system with excellent
33	highways, public transportation, passenger and freight rail, airports, and ports; now, therefore, be it
34	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That there is hereby created the
35 36	Commission on Virginia's Transportation Needs. The Commission shall have a total membership of 21 members that shall consist of former Governors Gerald L. Baliles and George Allen, 10 legislative
30 37	members, four members at large, and five ex officio members. Members shall be appointed as follows:
38	six members of the House of Delegates, three shall be the chairs of the House Appropriations, Finance,
39	and Transportation Committees, and three shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates,
40	in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of
41	Delegates; four members of the Senate, two shall be the chairs of the Senate Finance and Transportation
42 43	Committees, and two shall be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; and four members at large to be appointed by the Covernor, two representing the transportation related business community and
43 44	to be appointed by the Governor, two representing the transportation-related business community and two local government officials. Former Governors Baliles and Allen shall serve as co-chairs of the
45	Commission. The Secretary of Transportation, the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation,
46	the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation, the Director of the Department of
47	Aviation, and the Executive Director of the Virginia Port Authority shall serve as ex officio, nonvoting
48	members.
49 50	The Commission shall (i) review and update the findings of the Commission on Transportation for the Twenty First Century and later efforts undertaken to assess the needs of all modes of transportation
50 51	the Twenty-First Century and later efforts undertaken to assess the needs of all modes of transportation in the Commonwealth including: the work of the Select Committee Studying the Transportation Trust
51 52	Fund under Senate Joint Resolution No. 240 (1993), Senate Joint Resolution No. 143 (1994), House
53	Joint Resolution No. 160 (1996), and VTRANS 2030; (ii) identify those major transportation system
54	construction projects whose construction will be required over the next 10 years and the needs of public
55	transportation; (iii) determine the amount of additional transportation revenue to be required over that
56 57	period to cover these costs; (iv) study alternatives for planning and financing the comprehensive
57 58	transportation system Virginia will need over the next decade; and (v) study existing transportation agencies and authorities and the need to create, restructure, and combine agencies and authorities for
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59 Virginia.

The staffs of the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Finance, and the
Division of Legislative Services shall provide support for the study. The Secretary of Transportation,
with the assistance of agencies under his direction, shall provide such technical assistance as the
Commission may require. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the
Commission, upon request.

The Commission shall complete its work in time to report its findings and recommendations by December 1, 2009, to the Governor and the 2010 Session of the General Assembly. The report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. The direct costs of the Commission's work shall not exceed \$13,600 without approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the co-chairs of the Commission and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other

72 chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.

73 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
 74 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the
 75 study.
