3 *certify buildings as energy-efficient for purposes of local real property taxes.*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 58.1-3221.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

8 § 58.1-3221.2. Classification of certain energy-efficient buildings for tax purposes.

9 A. Energy-efficient buildings, not including the real estate or land on which they are located, are
10 hereby declared to be a separate class of property and shall constitute a classification for local taxation
11 separate from other classifications of real property. The governing body of any county, city, or town
12 may, by ordinance, levy a tax on the value of such buildings at a different rate from that of tax levied
13 on other real property. The rate of tax imposed by any county, city, or town on such buildings shall not
14 exceed that applicable to the general class of real property.

15 B. For purposes of this section, an energy-efficient building is any building that exceeds the energy
16 efficiency standards prescribed in the Virginia Uniform Statewide Building Code by 30 percent.
17 Energy-efficient building certification for purposes of this subsection shall be determined by any
18 qualified ~~licensed~~ architect, professional engineer, or *licensed* contractor who is not related to the
19 taxpayer and who shall certify to the taxpayer that he or she has qualifications to provide the
20 certification.

21 C. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection B, for purposes of this section, an energy-efficient
22 building may also be any building that (i) meets or exceeds performance standards of the Green Globes
23 Green Building Rating System of the Green Building Initiative, (ii) meets or exceeds performance
24 standards of the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Green Building Rating System
25 of the U.S. Green Building Council, (iii) meets or exceeds performance standards or guidelines under
26 the EarthCraft House Program, or (iv) is an Energy Star qualified home, the energy efficiency of which
27 meets or exceeds performance guidelines for energy efficiency under the Energy Star program developed
28 by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Energy-efficient building certification for
29 purposes of this subsection shall be determined by (a) the granting of a certification under one of the
30 programs in clauses (i) through (iv) that certifies the building meets or exceeds the performance
31 standards or guidelines of the program, or (b) a qualified, ~~licensed~~ architect or professional engineer
32 designated by the county, city, or town who shall determine whether the building meets or exceeds the
33 performance standards or guidelines under any program described in clauses (i) through (iv).
