092647696 **SENATE BILL NO. 1050** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Appropriations 4 on February 23, 2009) 5 6 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Whipple) A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.2-1514, as is currently effective and as may become effective, 7 10.1-546.1, and 10.1-2128.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia Natural Resources 8 Commitment Fund. 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: That §§ 2.2-1514, as is currently effective and as may become effective, 10.1-546.1, and 10 1. 11 10.1-2128.1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: § 2.2-1514. (Contingent expiration date - see Editor's notes) Designation of general fund for 12 13 nonrecurring expenditures. 14 A. As used in this section: "The Budget Bill" means the "The Budget Bill" submitted pursuant to § 2.2-1509, including any 15 16 amendments to a general appropriation act pursuant to such section. "Nonrecurring expenditures" means the acquisition or construction of capital outlay projects as 17 defined in § 2.2-1518, the acquisition or construction of capital improvements, the acquisition of land, 18 19 the acquisition of equipment, or other expenditures of a one-time nature as specified in the general 20 appropriation act. Such term shall not include any expenditures relating to transportation, including but 21 not limited to transportation maintenance. B. At the end of each fiscal year, the Comptroller shall designate within his annual report pursuant to 22 23 § 2.2-813 as follows: one-third of the remaining amount of the general fund balance that is not 24 otherwise reserved or designated shall be designated by the Comptroller for nonrecurring expenditures, and two-thirds shall be designated for deposit into the Transportation Trust Fund. No such designation 25 shall be made unless the full amounts required for other reserves or designations including, but not 26 27 limited to, (i) the Revenue Stabilization Fund deposit pursuant to § 2.2-1829, (ii) the Virginia Water 28 Quality Improvement Fund deposit pursuant to § 10.1-2128, but excluding any deposits provided under 29 the Virginia Natural Resources Commitment Fund established under § 10.1-2128.1, (iii) capital outlay 30 reappropriations pursuant to the general appropriation act, (iv) (a) operating expense reappropriations pursuant to the general appropriation act, and (b) reappropriations of unexpended appropriations to 31 certain public institutions of higher education pursuant to § 2.2-5005, (v) pro rata rebate payments to certain public institutions of higher education pursuant to § 2.2-5005, (vi) the unappropriated balance 32 33 34 anticipated in the general appropriation act for the end of such fiscal year, and (vii) interest payments on 35 deposits of certain public institutions of higher education pursuant to § 2.2-5005 are set aside. The 36 Comptroller shall set aside amounts required for clauses (iv) (b), (v), and (vii) beginning with the initial 37 fiscal year as determined under § 2.2-5005 and for all fiscal years thereafter. Ten percent of the one-third of the remaining general fund balance designated by the Comptroller for non-recurring 38 39 expenses shall be deposited into the Virginia Natural Resources Commitment Fund established under 40 § 10.1-2128.1, Code of Virginia. 41

C. The Governor shall include in "The Budget Bill" pursuant to § 2.2-1509 recommended 42 appropriations from the general fund or recommended amendments to general fund appropriations in the 43 general appropriation act in effect at that time an amount for nonrecurring expenditures and an amount for deposit into the Transportation Trust Fund equal to the amounts designated by the Comptroller for 44 45 such purposes pursuant to the provisions of subsection B. Such deposit to the Transportation Trust Fund shall not preclude the appropriation of additional amounts from the general fund for transportation 46 47 purposes.

§ 2.2-1514. (Contingent effective date - see Editor's notes) Designation of general fund for **48** 49 nonrecurring expenditures. 50

A. As used in this section:

51 "The Budget Bill" means the "The Budget Bill" submitted pursuant to § 2.2-1509, including any amendments to a general appropriation act pursuant to such section. 52

53 "Nonrecurring expenditures" means the acquisition or construction of capital outlay projects as 54 defined in § 2.2-1518, the acquisition or construction of capital improvements, the acquisition of land, the acquisition of equipment, or other expenditures of a one-time nature as specified in the general 55 appropriation act. 56

57 B. At the end of each fiscal year, the Comptroller shall designate within his annual report pursuant to § 2.2-813 an amount for nonrecurring expenditures, which shall equal the remaining amount of the 58 59 general fund balance that is not otherwise reserved or designated. No such designation shall be made

60 unless the full amounts required for other reserves or designations including, but not limited to, (i) the Revenue Stabilization Fund deposit pursuant to § 2.2-1829, (ii) the Virginia Water Quality Improvement 61 Fund deposit pursuant to § 10.1-2128, but excluding any deposits provided under the Virginia Natural 62 Resources Commitment Fund established under § 10.1-2128.1, (iii) capital outlay reappropriations 63 64 pursuant to the general appropriation act, (iv) (a) operating expense reappropriations pursuant to the 65 general appropriation act, and (b) reappropriations of unexpended appropriations to certain public 66 institutions of higher education pursuant to § 2.2-5005, (v) pro rata rebate payments to certain public institutions of higher education pursuant to § 2.2-5005, (vi) the unappropriated balance anticipated in the 67 general appropriation act for the end of such fiscal year, and (vii) interest payments on deposits of 68 certain public institutions of higher education pursuant to § 2.2-5005 are set aside. The Comptroller shall 69 set aside amounts required for clauses (iv) (b), (v), and (vii) beginning with the initial fiscal year as 70 71 determined under § 2.2-5005 and for all fiscal years thereafter. Ten percent of the one-third of the 72 remaining general fund balance designated by the Comptroller for non-recurring expenses shall be deposited into the Virginia Natural Resources Commitment Fund established under § 10.1-2128.1, Code 73 74 of Virginia.

C. The Governor shall include in "The Budget Bill" pursuant to § 2.2-1509 recommended 75 appropriations from the general fund or recommended amendments to general fund appropriations in the 76 general appropriation act in effect at that time an amount for nonrecurring expenditures equal to the 77 78 amount designated by the Comptroller for such purpose pursuant to the provisions of subsection B of 79 this section. 80

§ 10.1-546.1. Delivery of Agricultural Best Management Practices Cost-Share Program.

81 Districts shall locally deliver the Commonwealth's Virginia Agricultural Best Management Practices Cost-Share Assistance Program described under 10.1-2128.1, under the direction of the Department, as a 82 means of promoting voluntary adoption of conservation management practices by farmers and land 83 84 managers in support of the Department's nonpoint source pollution management program. 85

§ 10.1-2128.1. Virginia Natural Resources Commitment Fund established.

86 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 87 Virginia Natural Resources Commitment Fund hereafter referred to as "the Subfund," which shall be a 88 subfund of the Virginia Water Quality Improvement Fund and administered by the Department of 89 Conservation and Recreation. The Subfund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. All 90 amounts appropriated and such other funds as may be made available to the Subfund from any other 91 source, public or private, shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Subfund. Interest 92 earned on moneys in the Subfund shall remain in the Subfund and be credited to it. Any moneys 93 remaining in the Subfund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the 94 general fund but shall remain in the Subfund. Moneys in the Subfund shall be used as provided in subsection B solely for the purposes as described in subsection B Virginia Agricultural Best 95 Management Practices Cost-Share Program administered by the Department of Conservation and 96 97 Recreation.

98 B. Beginning on July 1, 2008, and continuing in each subsequent fiscal year until July 1, 2018, out 99 of such amounts as may be appropriated and deposited to the Subfund, distributions shall be made in 100 each fiscal year for the following purposes:

1. Five Eight percent of the total amount distributed to the Virginia Agricultural Best Management 101 102 Practices Cost-Share Program shall be distributed to soil and water conservation districts to provide 103 technical assistance for the implementation of such agricultural best management practices. Each soil and 104 water conservation district in the Commonwealth shall receive a share according to a method employed by the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation in consultation with the Virginia Soil 105 and Water Conservation Board, that accounts for the percentage of the available agricultural best 106 management practices funding that will be received by the district from the Virginia Natural Resource 107 108 Commitment Fund Subfund;

2. Fifty-sevenFifty-five percent of the total amount distributed to the Virginia Agricultural Best 109 110 Management Practices Cost-Share Program shall be used for matching grants for agricultural best 111 management practices on lands in the Commonwealth exclusively, or partly, within the Chesapeake Bay 112 watershed; and

3. Thirty-eight Thirty-seven percent of the total amount distributed to the Virginia Agricultural Best 113 114 Management Practices Cost-Share Program shall be used for matching grants for agricultural best 115 management practices on all other lands in the Commonwealth exclusively outside of the Chesapeake 116 Bay watershed in the Commonwealth.
