A BILL to amend and reenact § 15.2-1512.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to political activities of 7 local employees. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That § 15.2-1512.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 15.2-1512.2. Political activities of firefighters, emergency medical technicians and law-enforcement 11 officers and certain other officers and employees. A. For the purposes of this section: 12 "Emergency medical technician" means any person who is employed within the fire department or 13 public safety department of a locality whose primary responsibility is the provision of emergency 14 medical care to the sick or injured, using either basic or advanced techniques. Emergency medical 15 16 technicians may also provide fire protection services and assist in the enforcement of the fire prevention 17 code. "Firefighter" means any person who is employed within the fire department or public safety 18 department of a locality whose primary responsibility is the prevention or extinguishment of fires, the 19 20 protection of life and property, or the enforcement of local or state fire prevention codes or laws 21 pertaining to the prevention or control of fires. "Law-enforcement officer" means any person who is employed within the police department, bureau 22 or force of any locality, including the sheriff's department of any city or county, and who is authorized 24 by law to make arrests. 25 "Locality" means counties, cities, towns, authorities or special districts. 26 "Political campaign" means activities engaged in for the purpose of promoting a political issue, for 27 influencing the outcome of an election for local or state office, or for influencing the outcome of a 28 referendum or special election. 29 "Political candidate" means any person who has made known his or her intention to seek, or 30 campaign for, local or state office in a general, primary or special election. "Political party" means any party, organization or group having as its purpose the promotion of 31 32 political candidates or political campaigns. B. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, general or special, no locality shall prohibit an 33 34 employee of the locality, including firefighters, emergency medical technicians or law-enforcement 35 officers within its employment, or deputies, appointees and employees of local constitutional officers as 36 defined in § 15.2-1600, from participating in political activities while these employees are off duty, out 37 of uniform and not on the premises of their employment with the locality. 38 C. For purposes of this section, the term "political activities" includes, but is not limited to: voting; 39 registering to vote; soliciting votes or endorsements on behalf of a political candidate or political 40 campaign; expressing opinions, privately or publicly, on political subjects and candidates; displaying a political picture, sign, sticker, badge or button; participating in the activities of, or contributing 41 42 financially to, a political party, candidate or campaign or an organization that supports a political candidate or campaign; attending or participating in a political convention, caucus, rally, or other 43 44 political gathering; initiating, circulating or signing a political petition; engaging in fund-raising activities for any political party, candidate or campaign; acting as a recorder, watcher, challenger or similar officer 45 at the polls on behalf of a political party, candidate or campaign; or becoming a political candidate. 46 D. Firefighters Employees of a locality, including firefighters, emergency medical technicians, law-enforcement officers, and other employees specified in § 15.2-1512.2 subsection B are prohibited 47 **48** from using their official authority to coerce or attempt to coerce a subordinate employee to pay, lend or 49 contribute anything of value to a political party, candidate or campaign, or to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of that person's political affiliations or political activities, except as such affiliation or activity may be established by law as disqualification for employment. E. Firefighters Employees of a locality, including firefighters, emergency medical technicians, law-enforcement officers, and other employees specified in § 15.2-1512.2 subsection B are prohibited 53

54 from discriminating in the provision of public services, including but not limited to fire fighting, 55 emergency medical, or law-enforcement services, or responding to requests for such services, on the 56 basis of the political affiliations or political activities of the person or organization for which such 57 58 services are provided or requested. 59
