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A BILL to request the Department of Environmental Quality to develop a statewide waste management

9 1. § 1. That the Department of Environmental Quality shall prepare a comprehensive Virginia Waste Management Plan (the "Plan") consistent with the policy and objectives of the Virginia Waste 10 Management Act (§ 10.1-1400 et seq. of the Code of Virginia). 11 12

13 1. Measurable goals, including waste reduction, and minimum recycling rates over a 20-year period 14 with interim goals set at five-year intervals;

15 2. Procedures by which goals and minimum recycling rates may be examined periodically to reflect 16 changing circumstances such as new technologies:

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19 5. Recommendations for legislative changes needed to implement the goals and minimum recycling 20 rates set forth in the Plan.

B. The Plan shall be developed in consultation with affected stakeholders including solid waste 21 22 planning units; local government officials; waste management facilities; recycling and composting 23 processors; conservation and environmental interests; producers, manufacturers, and retailers whose 24 products may become part of the waste stream; and public health authorities. To the extent appropriate, 25 the Plan should review and rely upon existing studies, plans, and reports such as the regional and local solid waste management plans and Senate Document No. 14 (2008), Waste Reduction Efforts in 26
