234567 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Virginia by adding in Article X a section numbered 6-A, relating to a property tax exemption for certain veterans.

8 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, a majority of the members elected to 9 each house agreeing, That the following amendment to the Constitution of Virginia be, and the same hereby is, proposed and referred to the General Assembly at its first regular session held after the next 10 general election of members of the House of Delegates for its concurrence in conformity with the 11 provisions of Section 1 of Article XII of the Constitution of Virginia, namely: 12

13 Amend the Constitution of Virginia by adding in Article X a section numbered 6-A as follows: 14

ARTICLE X

15 TAXATION AND FINANCE Section 6-A. Property tax exemption for certain veterans.

16 Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 6, the General Assembly by general law, and within the 17 18 restrictions and conditions prescribed therein, shall exempt from taxation the real property, including the joint real property of husband and wife, of any veteran who has been determined by the United 19 20 States Department of Veterans Affairs or its successor agency pursuant to federal law to have a one

21 hundred percent service-connected, permanent, and total disability and who occupies the real property 22 as his or her principal place of residence. The General Assembly shall also provide this exemption from

23 taxation for real property owned by the surviving spouse of a veteran who was eligible for the

24 exemption provided in this section, so long as the surviving spouse does not remarry and continues to

25 occupy the real property as his or her principal place of residence.
