4	Establishing a joint committee of the Senate Committee for Courts of Justice and the House Committee
5	for Courts of Justice to study regular assignment of judicial personnel outside of established circuit
6 7	boundaries. Report.

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11	WHEREAS, the current boundaries of the several judicial circuits were established over 30 years ago
12	based on assumptions of caseload and population movement and trends that now, more than a generation
13	later, have either come to pass or have changed or even reversed course; and
14 15	WHEREAS, other factors influencing caseloads in some circuits include the successful use of mediation and other docket control measures, the aging of the population in certain areas of the
15 16	mediation and other docket control measures, the aging of the population in certain areas of the Commonwealth, the imbalance of caseloads between localities within circuits, and the explosive
17	population growth in other circuits that not so long ago were considered rural areas; and
18	WHEREAS, although recommended as necessary by the administration of the court system, the
19	General Assembly has been unable to create new judgeships in the last several years due to financial
20	constraints; and
21	WHEREAS, a more fluid manner of assigning caseloads may better serve the needs of the citizens
22 23	and provide a way in which the judicial system can handle imbalances in caseloads without the time and expense of seeking additional judicial personnel; now, therefore, be it
23 24	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a joint committee of the Senate
25	Committee for Courts of Justice and the House Committee for Courts of Justice be established to study
26	regular assignment of judicial personnel outside of established circuit boundaries. The joint committee
27	shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its membership.
28	In conducting its study, the joint committee shall consider a plan for using judicial personnel across
29 30	circuit lines and may also consider redistricting the current boundaries of the several judicial circuits, if
30 31	found appropriate. Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the Senate. Legal,
32	research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint committee shall be provided by the
33	Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall be provided by the Office of the Executive
34	Secretary of the Supreme Court, upon request of the joint committee. All agencies of the
35	Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the joint committee for this study, upon request.
36	The joint committee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2009 interim and four meetings for the
37 38	2010 interim. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the joint committee and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint
39	resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.
40	No recommendation of the joint committee shall be adopted if a majority of the Senate members or a
41	majority of the House members of the joint committee (i) vote against the recommendation and (ii) vote
42	for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the joint committee.
43	The joint committee shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2009, and for the
44 45	second year by November 30, 2010, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first
4 6	day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall
47	state whether the joint committee intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report
48	of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive
49	summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative
50	Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the
51 52	General Assembly's website. Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
52 53	Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or
54	delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2009 or 2010
55	interim.

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
