WHEREAS, a knowledgeable sportsman, Duane Preston was an avid hunter and fisherman, and he shared his sporting expertise and respect for nature with younger generations at 4-H camps and Ducks Unlimited exhibitions: and

WHEREAS, Duane Preston gave his time, talent, and resources to many community organizations and events, and he was a great supporter of the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries and its numerous projects, and a lifetime member of the National Rifle Association; and

WHEREAS, Duane Preston enjoyed exploring history and described himself as an "armchair archeologist," and he was an enthusiastic member and supporter of the Archeology Society of Virginia;

WHEREAS, a kind and loving family man, Duane Preston will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his devoted wife of 41 years, Teresa Preston; his sons, Dan and David Preston; his brothers and sisters and their families; and his numerous friends and admirers; now, therefore, be it
