5 6	WHEREAS, Melvin Ross Simpson, a beloved family physician and longtime grass roots and civil
7	rights activist, died on February 9, 2009; and
8	WHEREAS, a native of Norfolk, Melvin Simpson was born on July 26, 1925, to Paul and Zenobia
9	Simpson; and
10	WHEREAS, Melvin Simpson proudly served his country during both World War II and the Korean
11	War; and
12	WHEREAS, after receiving a bachelor's degree from Virginia State College (now University), Melvin
13	Simpson received his medical degree from Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tennessee; and
14	WHEREAS, a devoted and caring physician, Dr. Melvin Simpson began his family practice in
15	Newport News in 1957 and served the community diligently for many years; and
16	WHEREAS, actively involved in his profession, Dr. Melvin Simpson was one of the founders of the
17	Peninsula Association for Sickle Cell Anemia and was a charter member of the American Academy of
18	Family Physicians; he also served as president of the Old Dominion Medical Society; and
19	WHEREAS, Melvin Simpson generously gave of his time and talents over the years as a member
20	and former president of the Hampton Branch of the NAACP; as a member of the Citizens Boys and
21	Girls Club of Hampton board, the City Charter Commission of Hampton, Senior Citizens Advisory
22	Board of Hampton, American Cancer Society, and American Red Cross; and as a member of the board
23	of visitors of Virginia State University; and
24	WHEREAS, Melvin Simpson also proudly mentored 12 young men from Hampton High School, Los
25	Valientes (The Valients), in the late 1960s, was a member of the Beau Brummell Civic and Social Club,
26 27	and served as an usher and on the board of trustees for Third Baptist Church; and WHEREAS, Dr. Melvin Simpson received many awards and accolades during his life for his work,
