WHEREAS, mindful of the needs of the community, Hank Gregory was active in the community as a leader and supporter of First Presbyterian Church, a member of the GE Elfun Society, and a volunteer with Meals on Wheels; and

WHEREAS, a strong advocate of the Republican Party, Hank Gregory was elected to serve several terms as treasurer of the Roanoke County Republican Party; and

WHEREAS, a humble and gracious man, Hank Gregory generously gave his time and talents and treasure to support his church and other agencies; and

WHEREAS, Hank Gregory will be remembered for his kind and generous nature and sorely missed by his loving wife, Imogene Dean; his children, Henry, Lorinda, and Scott and their families; stepchildren, Nancy, Lawrence, and Mary Beth and their families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it
