- 5. Summary: The enrolled bill extends until July 30, 2009, the grandfather period for licensure as an esthetician or master esthetician for any individual who (i) has at least three years of documented work experience as an esthetician or a master esthetician that is deemed satisfactory by the board; (ii) has completed a training program that is deemed satisfactory by the board; or (iii) holds an unexpired certificate of registration, certification, or license as an esthetician or a master esthetician issued to him on the basis of comparable requirements by a proper authority of a state, territory, or possession of the United States, or the District of Columbia.
- **6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary. See item 8.
- 7. **Budget Amendment Necessary:** No. The department can absorb costs associated with notifying existing cosmetology licensees of the grandfathering provision within its current funding levels.
- **8. Fiscal Implications:** Printing and mailing costs for the notification are expected to be approximately \$3,200.
- **9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** The Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation
- 10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No
- **11. Other Comments:** The second enactment clause states that an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.

The third enactment clause states that the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation shall provide widespread notification to those affected by the provisions of this Act.
