Under current law, persons convicted of a Class 1 felony may be sentenced to death or life imprisonment. The proposed legislation would eliminate the death penalty for Class 1 felony offenses committed on and after July 1, 2009.

Appropriation required by § 30-19.1:4: \$70,220

Pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission estimates a fiscal impact of \$70,220 (the highest annual cost over the next six years). The amount is based on the projection that the legislation will result in three additional inmates being incarcerated in prison by FY 2013 rather than being executed.
