4. Title: Students called to active military duty may receive full academic credit.

5. Summary: Provides that in certain circumstances a student called to active military duty during a course at an institution of higher education may still receive full course credit.

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation requires the Boards of Visitors at each institution to develop policies to accommodate these students. This legislation is in effect the same as awarding a student an incomplete, or “I” and allows the student to complete the coursework upon the return from military duties. It is not anticipated this would have any significant impact to the colleges and universities.
