4. Title: Virginia Retirement System; members disabled or killed while in the military.

- **5. Summary:** Virginia Retirement System; members disabled or killed while in the military. Modifies several provisions governing the benefits of members who are disabled or killed, to comport with the federal Heroes Earnings Assistance and Relief Tax Act (HEART Act) for those members disabled or killed in action in the military.
- **6. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** There is no fiscal impact.

- **9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** VRS and VRS participating employers who have employees who are called to active duty military service

## 11. Other Comments:

Currently, a VRS covered employee who is called up for active duty can be on leave without pay for up to 24 months and still be eligible to receive VRS benefits.

This legislation eliminates the 24 month restriction and allows members serving on active duty to be covered for retirement, accidental death and dismemberment insurance, and life insurance as long as they are serving.

The Board of Trustees of the VRS requested this legislation.
