3. Committee: Passed both Houses.

4. Title: Oversight of research and development in the Commonwealth

5. Summary: The enrolled bill merges the Innovative Technology Authority (ITA), and the Virginia Research and Technology Advisory Commission (VRTAC) into a single entity, named the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Investment Authority (IEIA). The IEIA will have 13 members as follows: three presidents of the major research state institutions of higher education, one president representing the other state institutions of higher education, the Secretary of Technology, three nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the Governor, and six nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the General Assembly. The IEIA will continue the work of the ITA, with heightened responsibilities regarding the oversight of research and development efforts in the Commonwealth.

These savings have already been identified and taken in the Governor's budget reduction plan and are reflected in appropriations made in HB 1600.

11. Other Comments: The enrolled bill is identical to the enrolled bill for SB 1456.
