4. Title: Oversight of research and development in the Commonwealth

5. Summary: The substitute bill merges the Innovative Technology Authority (ITA), and the Virginia Research and Technology Advisory Commission (VRTAC) into a single entity, named the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Investment Authority (IEIA). The IEIA will have 10 members as follows: three presidents of state institutions of higher education, the Secretary of Technology, and six nonlegislative citizen members representing the entrepreneurial, investment, and science and technology communities. The IEIA will continue the work of the ITA, with heightened responsibilities regarding the oversight of research and development efforts in the Commonwealth. The substitute bill also excludes the IEIA from Code that prohibits the appointment of a legislator to a board, commission, or council.
