4. Title: Virginia Consumer Protection Act; foreclosure rescues

5. Summary: The bill provides that the prohibition on fraudulent acts or practices committed by a supplier in a consumer transaction involving residential real property owned and occupied as the primary dwelling unit of the owner applies when the supplier of service to avoid or prevent foreclosure charges or receives a fee (i) prior to the full and complete performance of the services it has agreed to perform, if the transaction does not involve the sale or transfer of residential real property, or (ii) prior to the settlement on the sale or transfer of residential real property, if the transaction involves the sale or transfer of the property.
