4. Title: **Freedom of Information Act; building and fire code complaints.**

5. Summary: The proposed legislation would expand the current record exemption to include the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of complainants furnished in confidence during an investigation of individual complaints regarding to the Uniform Statewide Building Code or the Statewide Fire Prevention Code. The bill provides that the provisions of the bill shall not prevent the disclosure of information relating to any building in connection with an inquiry into the performance of that building after it has been subjected to fire, explosion, natural disaster, or other catastrophic event.
