Federal economic stimulus funds.

- 5. Summary: Provides that any federal economic stimulus funds made available to Virginia for transportation and education infrastructure shall be used exclusively: 1) for payments to private contractors and not state or local employees, with any private contracts accompanied by performance measure standards; 2) to attract private sector funding using strategies permitted under the Public-Private Transportation Act (PPTA) and the Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act (PPEA); and 3) shall not be used to calculate or reduce share of local, federal or state revenues otherwise available for highway districts, local governments, or local school divisions. In awarding contracts, preference is to be given to Virginia businesses and Virginia subcontractors. For transportation funds, these funds are to be used for projects removed from the six-year transportation plan, with an effort to apportion the funding consistent with the highway construction funds allocation formulas. For school funding, all funding is to be used for local school division projects, with first priority for improvement projects, followed by new construction projects.
