4. Title: Electricity generated from municipal solid waste and net metering.

5. Summary: Electricity generated from municipal solid waste and net metering. Clarifies that facilities used to produce electric energy from municipal solid waste meet the definition of qualified project for purposes of the Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act of 2002. The bill also raises the generating capacity limit for nonresidential customer-generators from 500 kilowatts to five megawatts to qualify for the net energy metering program.

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: House Bill 2576 could potentially result in an insignificant reduction in utility tax collections since electric utility billings could be slightly lower. The fiscal impact, if any, on public entities under the Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act of 2002 (state agencies, authorities and localities) is unknown.
