3. Committee: General Laws and Technology

4. Title: Annual and biennial reports of state entities; online posting

5. Summary: The substitute bill requires agencies, institutions, collegial bodies, and other governmental entities that are specifically required by the Code of Virginia to report annually or biennially to the Governor and General Assembly to post the reports on the respective entity's website. The bill also limits the number of hard copies of the reports that such entities may print up to 100.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate.

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: Statewide impacts cannot be determined without identifying and canvassing all governmental entities with annual reports. However, it is projected that costs, if any, would be minimal and likely absorbed within existing budgets. It is common practice for agencies to post reports on their website. Also, mandated reports generally have a low number of required recipients, minimizing the potential fiscal or other impact of limiting prints. It is possible the bill could generate cost savings by reducing the number of hard copies of reports printed.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Any governmental entities that are specifically required by the Code of Virginia to report annually or biennially.
