4. Title: Smoking in cars with minor present; civil penalty.

5. Summary: Makes it unlawful for a person to smoke in a motor vehicle, whether in motion or at rest, in which a minor is present, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100. No citation shall be issued unless the driver is stopped for violation of some other provision of this code or local ordinance relating to the operation, ownership, or maintenance of a motor vehicle or any criminal statute.
