- 7. Budget Amendment Necessary: Yes, Item 475.
- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The Virginia Community College System indicates that a change in the legislation and code will increase the number of eligible students by 15 percent. This considers that half of the eligible students will receive the science, technology, education mathematics, and nursing (STEMN) award. This funding would be required in addition to the funding provided by the Governor for this program in the introduced budget.
- **9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** All state colleges and universities, and not for profit colleges accepting transfer students, State Council of Higher Education for Virginia.
- **10. Technical Amendment Necessary:** Yes, a change in the Code of Virginia, §23-38.10:10, eliminating the associate degree requirement will be required.
