3. Committee: Education and Health

4. Title: Eastern Virginia Medical School

5. Summary: The substitute bill makes technical corrections to the legislation to delete language that is no longer needed and changes the appointments to “nonlegislative citizens” rather than members of the General Assembly. Additional appointment power is granted to the Senate Rules Committee, Speaker of the House of Delegates, and Governor. The intent of the bill stays the same.

6. No Fiscal Impact. Preliminary.

7. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed legislation changes the composition and alters the way in which the Eastern Virginia Medical School Board of Visitors is appointed. The Board will consist of 17 members, with the following appointments: two members appointed by the Governor, three members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, two members by the Senate Committee on Rules, six members to be appointed by the Eastern Virginia Medical School Foundation, and four members to be appointed by the region’s city councils from nominees submitted by the Board.

Effective July 1, 2009, and as vacancies on the Board occur among previous members appointed by the region’s city councils, the Commonwealth’s three appointing bodies shall make appointments in a rotating manner until all appointments are made. Appointments shall be made in a rotating manner until such time as their initial appointments are all made. Since the number of board members stays the same, there is no fiscal impact.

11. Other Comments: Senate Bill 1249 is similar to House Bill 2433.
