8.	<b>Fiscal Implications:</b> Over the past seven fiscal years, ABC has collected between \$1.4-\$2.7 million annually in civil penalty revenues. In FY2008, civil penalties for first time offenders totaled \$1.3 million, which was 90 percent of the total penalties (\$1.4 million) collected. Eliminating 90 percent of the penalties collected would require a corresponding downward revision in the profit estimate included in the Appropriations Act.
