Generally

Currently, every county is required to conduct a general reassessment of real estate every four years. However, in lieu of conducting assessments every four years, counties are authorized to use an annual or biennial assessment method.

Counties with a total population of 50,000 or less may elect by majority vote of its board of supervisors to conduct its general reassessments at five or six-year intervals. According to the 2000 Census, Augusta County has a population of 65,615 people, and therefore, does not qualify to conduct its general reassessments at five or six-year intervals under current law.

<u>Proposal</u>

This bill would authorize Augusta County to elect by majority vote of its board of supervisors, to conduct its general reassessments at either five or six-year intervals.

The effective date of this bill is not specified.
