**4. Title:** **Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation; regulation of polygraph examiners.**

**5. Summary:** The bill provides that no person, other than a federal, state, or local law-enforcement officer, shall operate any instrument or device to detect deception or verify the truth of statements that does not meet the minimum instrumentation requirements set forth in § 54.1-1805, Code of Virginia. However, no law-enforcement officer shall use such instrument or device for internal or pre-employment investigations. The bill specifies the conditions under which law-enforcement officers may use other types of polygraph instruments.
