5.	<b>Summary:</b> Creates an annual mixed beverage rural event facility license for persons operating food and beverage services at any rural event and entertainment park or similar facility owned by a duly organized nonprofit corporation that has been granted an exemption from federal taxation under § 501 (c) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and has a minimum of 60,000 square feet of indoor exhibit space, equine and other livestock show areas and is located in Caroline County. The license authorizes the licensee to serve or sell alcoholic beverages during scheduled events or performances immediately subsequent thereto, to patrons in all dining facilities, seating areas, viewing areas, walkways, concession areas or similar facilities, for on-premises consumption.

8.	<b>Fiscal Implications:</b> This legislation creates a mixed beverage rural event facility license for the State Fair complex in Caroline County. The minimal revenue fiscal impact is expected to be \$625 (\$560 for the license and \$65 non-refundable deposit fee). It is anticipated this revenue would be sufficient to cover any additional costs associated with this legislation (i.e enforcement).
