**4. Title Larceny**

**5. Summary/Purpose:**

A current statute defines the theft of bank notes, checks, or other writings or papers of value as larceny and states that anyone who commits such an offense shall receive the same penalty as anyone convicted of the larceny of goods. The proposed legislation provides a reference in this statute to the statutes that explicitly set out the penalty for larceny.

**8. Fiscal implications:**

Because the proposed legislation only clarifies existing law and does not create a new offense or expand an existing offense, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission has concluded that, pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the proposal will not result in an increase in the population of state prisons or local jails.
