10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 46.2-931 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-931. Certain localities may prohibit or regulate distribution of handbills, etc., solicitation of
13	contributions, and sale of merchandise on highways within their boundaries.
14	A. Arlington, Hanover, Henrico, and Spotsylvania Counties, the Cities of Falls Church and
15	Richmond, and the Town Towns of Vienna and West Point are hereby authorized to adopt ordinances
16	prohibiting or regulating:
17	1. The distribution of handbills, leaflets, bulletins, literature, advertisements, or similar material to the
18	occupants of motor vehicles on highways located within their boundaries;
<b>19</b>	2. The solicitation of contributions of any nature from the occupants of motor vehicles on highways
20	located within their boundaries; and
21	3. The sale of merchandise or the attempted sale of merchandise to the occupants of motor vehicles
22	on highways located within their boundaries.
23	B. Albemarle, Greene, Hanover, Loudoun, and Spotsylvania Counties and, the Cities of Falls Church
24	and Richmond, and the Town of West Point are hereby authorized to adopt ordinances regulating:
25	1. The distribution of handbills, leaflets, bulletins, literature, advertisements, or similar material to the
26 27	occupants of motor vehicles on public roadways and medians; 2. The solicitation of contributions of any nature from the occupants of motor vehicles on public

20 29	3. The sale of merchandise or the attempted sale of merchandise to the occupants of motor vehicles
<b>3</b> 0	on public roadways and medians.
31	C. Ordinances adopted pursuant to this section may provide that any person violating the provisions
32	of such ordinances shall be guilty of a traffic infraction.
33	D. The Virginia Department of Transportation may regulate activities within such streets and
34	highways under its jurisdiction, subject to regulations promulgated by the Commonwealth Transportation
35	Board. Nothing in this section shall be construed to allow any locality to permit activities within any
36	highway under the maintenance and operational jurisdiction of the Virginia Department of
37	Transportation.
