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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 13.2 of Title 22.1 a section
12	numbered 22.1-253.13:9 as follows:
13	§ 22.1-253.13:9. Virginia Index of Performance incentive program.
14	A. Schools and local school divisions shall be recognized by the Board of Education in accordance
15	with guidelines it shall establish for the Virginia Index of Performance (VIP) incentive program. The
16	VIP incentive program shall be designed to recognize and reward fully accredited schools and school
17	divisions that make significant progress toward achieving advanced proficiency levels in reading,
18	mathematics, science, and history and social science, and on other indicators of school and student
19	performance that are aligned with the Commonwealth's goals for public education. Such recognition
20	may include:
21	1. Public announcements recognizing individual schools and divisions;
22	2. Tangible rewards;
23	3. Waivers of certain board regulations;
24	4. Exemptions from certain reporting requirements; or 5. Other commendations downed appropriate to recognize high achievement.
25 26	5. Other commendations deemed appropriate to recognize high achievement. In addition to Board recognition, local school boards shall adopt policies to recognize individual
20 27	schools through public announcements or media releases as well as other appropriate recognition.
28	B. A school that maintains a passing rate on Virginia assessment program tests or additional tests
2 9	approved by the Board of 95 percent or above in each of the four core academic areas for two
3 0	consecutive years may, upon application to the Department of Education, receive a waiver from annual
31	accreditation. A school receiving such a waiver shall be fully accredited for a three-year period.
32	However, such school shall continue to annually submit documentation in compliance with the
33	pre-accreditation eligibility requirements.
34	C. Schools may be eligible to receive the Governor's Award for Outstanding Achievement. This
35	award will be given to schools rated fully accredited that significantly increase the achievement of

students within student subgroups in accordance with guidelines prescribed by the Board of Education. 2. That the Board of Education shall include in its guidelines for the VIP incentive program performance objectives and measures and shall include a school division's increase in enrollments

and course offerings in engineering and technology-based career and technical education courses

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as one such measure.
