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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 3.2 a chapter numbered 55.1, consisting of 3 sections numbered 3.2-5508 through 3.2-5516, relating to waste kitchen grease; transportation; fees; 4 penalty.

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## Approved

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1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 3.2 a chapter numbered 55.1, 8 9 consisting of sections numbered 3.2-5508 through 3.2-5516, as follows: 10

*CHAPTER 55.1.* 

## WASTE KITCHEN GREASE.

§ 3.2-5508. Definitions.

As used in this chapter unless the context requires a different meaning:

14 "Food establishment" means those operations subject to regulation by the Virginia Department of 15 Health as food establishments under the authority granted by § 35.1-14.

16 "Registrant" means any person who has registered with the Department as a transporter of waste 17 kitchen grease.

18 "Renderer" means any person who commercially cooks carcasses, or parts or products of carcasses, 19 of cattle, swine, poultry, and other animals and other waste animal by-products and waste kitchen 20 grease into usable products.

21 "Transport" or "transportation" means the movement of waste kitchen grease in a motor vehicle on 22 public roads.

23 "Trap grease" means waste kitchen grease that is removed from a grease trap and is principally 24 derived from food preparation and processing.

25 "Usable products" means a product resulting from the processing of waste kitchen grease and shall 26 include biofuels, lubricants, and animal feed, provided that such animal feed uses are allowed by the 27 U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

28 "Waste kitchen grease" means animal fats or vegetable oils that have been used, and will not be 29 reused, for cooking in a food establishment, including trap grease. 30

§ 3.2-5509. Application; registration term; fees.

31 A. Except as provided in § 3.2-5510, on and after September 1, 2010, any person who transports 32 waste kitchen grease shall submit an application for registration to the Department not less than 30 days before such transportation. Registration shall be for a term no longer than one year. The 33 34 application shall be submitted in accordance with a procedure established by the Department for this 35 purpose. The application shall include:

36 1. The applicant's name and address; 37

2. A description of the operations to be performed by the applicant;

38 3. The make, model, license number, and vehicle identification number of any vehicle to be used for 39 the transportation of waste kitchen grease;

40 4. A nonrefundable application fee of \$100; 41

5. A fee of \$100 per vehicle used to transport waste kitchen grease; and

42 6. Proof of personal injury and property damage liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1 43 million.

44 B. The Department shall issue each registrant a unique registration number and a registration 45 certificate. 46

§ 3.2-5510. Individual use; limitations and additional requirements.

A. An individual who transports waste kitchen grease for his own conversion to biofuel shall not be 47 48 required to register pursuant to § 3.2-5509 provided that he:

49 1. Transports waste kitchen grease in a container or containers with a total capacity of no more 50 than 275 gallons on any one vehicle at any time;

2. Possesses or controls no more than 1,320 gallons of waste kitchen grease, biofuel feedstock 51 derived from waste kitchen grease, or biofuel at any time, excluding biofuel contained in vehicle fuel 52 53 tanks used to power the vehicle's movement; and

54 3. Does not obtain waste kitchen grease from (i) a container owned by a registered transporter of 55 waste kitchen grease, (ii) a food establishment under contract with a registered transporter of waste 56 kitchen grease, or (iii) a container owned by a renderer or collection center.

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57 B. An individual who transports waste kitchen grease to a facility for the purpose of conversion to 58 biofuel shall not be required to register pursuant to § 3.2-5509 provided that:

59 1. He meets all the requirements of subsection A:

60 2. He transports waste kitchen grease to no more than one facility, other than on his own property, 61 during a one-day period;

62 3. Such facility has a capacity to produce no more than 500 gallons per day of biofuel; and

4. Such facility does not possess or control more than 1,320 gallons of waste kitchen grease, biofuel 63 64 feedstock derived from waste kitchen grease, or biofuel at any time, excluding biofuel contained in 65 vehicle fuel tanks to power the vehicle's movement.

§ 3.2-5511. Recordkeeping. 66

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67 Every registrant shall record, maintain for two years, and make available for inspection by the 68 Department the following information:

69 1. The name and address of each location or person from which the registrant obtained the waste 70 kitchen grease for transportation; 71

2. The quantity of material received from each location or person;

3. The date on which the waste kitchen grease was obtained from each location or person; and

73 4. The renderer or other processor to which the waste kitchen grease was delivered. 74

§ 3.2-5512. Possession of certificate; display of registration information on motor vehicle.

75 No person required to register under this chapter shall transport waste kitchen grease without (i) 76 having in his possession a registration certificate and (ii) conspicuously displaying the registrant's name 77 and the registration number in letters not less than three inches high on any vehicle used for the 78 transportation of waste kitchen grease.

79 § 3.2-5513. Suspension or revocation.

80 A. The Commissioner may suspend or revoke a registration at any time if, in his discretion, the 81 registrant has:

82 1. Sold or offered for sale to an unregistered person any waste kitchen grease knowing such 83 unregistered person would transport such waste kitchen grease in violation of this chapter;

84 2. Stolen, misappropriated, contaminated, or damaged any waste kitchen grease container or grease 85 therein; or

86 3. Taken possession of waste kitchen grease from an unregistered transporter other than as allowed 87 in subsection A of § 3.2-5515, or has knowingly taken possession of waste kitchen grease that has been 88 stolen.

89 B. For purposes of this section, the term "registrant" also includes any person who holds more than 90 a five percent equity, ownership, or debt liability in the person registered to engage in the 91 transportation of waste kitchen grease. 92

§ 3.2-5514. Waste Kitchen Grease Fund established.

93 There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Waste Kitchen Grease Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books 94 95 of the Comptroller. All funds collected under this chapter shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited 96 97 to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for **98** 99 carrying out the purposes of this chapter. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made 100 by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the 101 Commissioner. 102

§ 3.2-5515. Penalty.

103 A. Except for waste kitchen grease transported and delivered pursuant to § 3.2-5510, on and after 104 September 1, 2010, no person shall take possession of more than 55 gallons of waste kitchen grease from an unregistered transporter unless the recipient maintains documentation for two years, which 105 shall be made available for inspection by the Department, of the (i) name and address of the person 106 107 delivering the waste kitchen grease, (ii) date of receipt of the waste kitchen grease, (iii) delivering 108 vehicle's license plate number and state of registration, and (iv) quantity delivered.

109 B. The Commissioner may assess a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 for any violation of a 110 provision of this chapter. 111

§ 3.2-5516. Appeals.

The Commissioner's suspension or revocation of a registration, or the imposition of a civil penalty, 112 113 may be appealed in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et 114 seq.).
