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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 23 a chapter numbered 26, consisting of 3 sections numbered 23-299 through 23-299.10, relating to college partnership laboratory schools.

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#### Approved

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 23 a chapter numbered 26, consisting 7 8 of sections numbered 23-299 through 23-299.10, as follows: 9

CHAPTER 26.

## ESTABLISHMENT OF COLLEGE PARTNERSHIP LABORATORY SCHOOLS.

§ 23-299. Objectives; definitions.

12 A. In order to (i) stimulate the development of innovative programs for preschool through grade 12 13 students; (ii) provide opportunities for innovative instruction and assessment; (iii) provide teachers with a vehicle for establishing schools with alternative innovative instruction and school scheduling, 14 15 management, and structure; (iv) encourage the use of performance-based educational programs; (v)16 establish high standards for both teachers and administrators; (vi) encourage greater collaboration 17 between education providers from preschool to the postsecondary level; and (vii) develop models for 18 replication in other public schools, college partnership laboratory schools may be established in 19 Virginia as provided in this chapter.

20 B. As used in this chapter:

21 "At-risk pupil" means a student having a physical, emotional, intellectual, socioeconomic, or cultural 22 risk factor, as defined in Board of Education criteria, which research indicates may negatively influence 23 educational success.

24 "College partnership laboratory school" means a public, nonsectarian, nonreligious school 25 established by a public institution of higher education that operates a teacher education program 26 approved by the Board of Education.

27 "Governing board" means the board of a college partnership laboratory school that is party to the 28 contract with the Board of Education, with the responsibility of creating, managing, and operating the 29 college partnership laboratory school, and whose members have been selected by the institution of 30 higher education establishing the college partnership laboratory school. The governing board shall be 31 under the control of the institution of higher education establishing the college partnership laboratory 32 school. 33

§ 23-299.1. College Partnership Laboratory School Fund established.

34 There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the College 35 Partnership Laboratory School Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. All funds appropriated in accordance with the appropriation act and 36 37 any gifts, grants, bequests, or donations from public or private sources shall be paid into the state 38 treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and 39 be credited to the Fund. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of 40 each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund 41 shall be used solely for the purposes of establishing or supporting college partnership laboratory 42 schools in the Commonwealth that stimulate the development of alternative education programs for 43 preschool through grade 12 students by providing opportunities for innovative instruction and greater 44 cooperation and coordination between institutions of higher education and preschool through grade 12 45 education systems. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the Superintendent of Public 46 Instruction. The Board of Education shall establish criteria for making distributions from the Fund to a 47 48 college partnership laboratory school requesting moneys from the Fund and may issue guidelines 49 governing the Fund as it deems necessary and appropriate.

50 § 23-299.2. Establishment and operation of college partnership laboratory schools; requirements.

A. A college partnership laboratory school shall be subject to all federal and state laws and 51 52 regulations and constitutional provisions prohibiting discrimination on the basis of disability, race, 53 creed, color, gender, national origin, religion, ancestry, or need for special education services.

54 Enrollment shall be open to any child who is deemed to reside within the Commonwealth through a 55 lottery process on a space-available basis. A waiting list shall be established if adequate space is not 56 available to accommodate all students whose parents have requested to be entered in the lottery

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process. Such waiting list shall also be prioritized through a lottery process and parents shall be 57 58 informed of their student's position on the list.

59 B. A college partnership laboratory school shall be administered and managed by a governing 60 board. Pursuant to a contract and as specified in § 23-299.3, a college partnership laboratory school 61 shall be subject to the requirements of the Standards of Quality, including the Standards of Learning and the Standards of Accreditation, and such regulations as determined by the Board of Education. 62

C. Pursuant to a college partnership laboratory school agreement, a college partnership laboratory 63 school shall be responsible for its own operations, including, but not limited to, such budget 64 65 preparation, contracts for services, and personnel matters as are specified in the agreement. A college partnership laboratory school may negotiate and contract with a school board, the governing body of a 66 67 public institution of higher education, or any third party for the use of a school building and grounds, the operation and maintenance thereof, and the provision of any service, activity, or undertaking that 68 the college partnership laboratory school is required to perform in order to carry out the educational 69 program described in its contract. Any services for which a college partnership laboratory school 70 contracts with a school board or institution of higher education shall not exceed the school division's or 71 72 institution's costs to provide such services.

73 D. A college partnership laboratory school shall not charge tuition.

74 E. An approved college partnership laboratory school shall be designated as a local education 75 agency, but shall not constitute a school division.

76 F. College partnership laboratory schools are encouraged to develop collaborative partnerships with 77 public school divisions for the purpose of building seamless education opportunities for all Virginia 78 students, from preschool to postsecondary education.

79 § 23-299.3. Contracts for college partnership laboratory schools; release from certain policies and 80 regulations.

81 The contract between the college partnership laboratory school and the Board of Education shall reflect all agreements regarding the release of the college partnership laboratory school from state 82 regulations, consistent with the requirements of subsection B of § 23-299.2. If the college partnership 83 84 laboratory school application proposes a program to increase the educational opportunities for at-risk 85 students, the Board of Education may approve an Individual School Accreditation Plan for the 86 evaluation of the performance of the school.

87 Any material revision of the terms of the contract may be made only with the approval of the Board 88 of Education and the governing board of the college partnership laboratory school.

89 § 23-299.4. College partnership laboratory school application.

90 A. Any public institution of higher education operating within the Commonwealth and having a 91 teacher education program approved by the Board of Education may submit an application for formation of a college partnership laboratory school. 92

93 B. Each college partnership laboratory school application shall provide or describe thoroughly all of 94 the following essential elements of the proposed school plan: 95

1. An executive summary;

96 2. The mission and vision of the proposed college partnership laboratory school, including 97 identification of the targeted student population;

98 3. The proposed location of the school;

99 4. The grades to be served each year for the full term of the contract;

100 5. Minimum, planned, and maximum enrollment per grade per year for the term of the contract;

6. Background information on the proposed founding governing board members and, if identified, the 101 102 proposed school leadership and management team;

103 7. The school's proposed calendar and sample daily schedule;

104 8. A description of the academic program aligned with state standards;

9. A description of the school's educational program, including the type of learning environment 105 (such as classroom-based or independent study), class size and structure, curriculum overview, and 106 107 *teaching methods;* 

10. The school's plan for using internal and external assessments to measure and report student 108 109 progress in accordance with the Standards of Learning;

110 11. The school's plans for identifying and successfully serving students with disabilities, students who are English language learners, students who are academically behind, and gifted students, including but 111 112 not limited to compliance with applicable laws and regulations;

12. A description of co-curricular and extracurricular programs and how they will be funded and 113 114 *delivered*;

115 13. Plans and timelines for student recruitment and enrollment, including lottery procedures if 116 sufficient space is unavailable;

117 14. The school's student disciplinary policies, including those for special education students; 15. An organization chart that clearly presents the school's organizational structure, including lines

of authority and reporting between the governing board, staff, any related bodies (such as advisory

bodies or parent and teacher councils), Board of Education, and any external organizations that will

121 play a role in managing the school: 122 16. A clear description of the roles and responsibilities for the governing board, the school's 123 leadership and management team, and any other entities shown in the organization chart; 124 17. A staffing chart for the school's first year and a staffing plan for the term of the contract; 125 18. Plans for recruiting and developing school leadership and staff; 126 19. The school's leadership and teacher employment policies, including performance evaluation 127 plans; 128 20. A plan for the placement of college partnership laboratory school pupils, teachers, and 129 employees upon termination or revocation of the contract; 130 21. Explanation of any partnerships or contractual relationships central to the school's operations or 131 mission; 132 22. The school's plans for providing transportation, food service, and all other significant 133 operational or ancillary services; 134 23. Opportunities and expectations for parent involvement; 135 24. A detailed school start-up plan, identifying tasks, timelines, and responsible individuals; 136 25. Description of the school's financial plan and policies, including financial controls and audit 137 requirements; 138 26. A description of the insurance coverage the school will obtain: 139 27. Start-up and five-year budgets with clearly stated assumptions; 140 28. Start-up and first-year cash-flow projections with clearly stated assumptions; 29. Evidence of anticipated fundraising contributions, if claimed in the application; 141 142 30. A sound facilities plan, including backup or contingency plans if appropriate; and 143 31. Assurances that the college partnership laboratory school (i) is nonreligious in its programs, 144 admission policies, employment practices, and all other operations and (ii) does not charge tuition. 145 The purposes of the college partnership laboratory school application are to present the proposed 146 school's academic and operational vision and plans, demonstrate the applicant's capacities to execute 147 the proposed vision and plans, and provide the Board of Education a clear basis for assessing the 148 applicant's plans and capacities. An approved college partnership laboratory school application shall 149 not serve as the school's contract. Within 90 days of approval of a college partnership laboratory 150 school application, the Board of Education and the governing board of the approved school shall 151 execute a contract that clearly sets forth the academic and operational performance expectations and 152 measures by which the college partnership laboratory school will be judged and the administrative 153 relationship between the Board of Education and the college partnership laboratory school, including 154 each party's rights and duties. The performance expectations and measures set forth in the contract shall include but need not be limited to applicable federal and state accountability requirements. The performance provisions may be refined or amended by mutual agreement after the college partnership 155

performance provisions may be refined or amended by mutual agreement after the college partnership laboratory school is operating and has collected baseline achievement data for its enrolled students.
 § 23-299.5. Review of college partnership laboratory school applications.

A. The Board of Education shall establish procedures for receiving, reviewing, and ruling upon applications and shall make a copy of any such procedures available to all interested parties upon request. If the Board finds the application is incomplete, the Board shall request the necessary information from the applicant. The Board of Education's review procedures shall establish a review committee that may include experts with the operation of similar schools located in other states.

B. To provide appropriate opportunity for input from parents, teachers, and other interested parties
and to obtain information to assist the Board of Education in its evaluation of a college partnership
laboratory school application, the Board of Education may establish a procedure for public notice,
comment, or hearings on such applications.

168 § 23-299.6. Decision of the Board of Education final.

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169 The decision of the Board of Education to grant or deny a college partnership laboratory school 170 application or to revoke or fail to renew an agreement shall be final and not subject to appeal.

171 § 23-299.7. College partnership laboratory school terms; renewals and revocations.

A. A college partnership laboratory school may be approved or renewed for a period not to exceed
five school years. A college partnership laboratory school renewal application submitted to the Board of
Education shall contain:

175 1. A report on the progress of the school in achieving the goals, objectives, program and
 176 performance standards for students, and such other conditions and terms as the Board of Education may
 177 require upon granting initial approval of the college partnership laboratory school application; and

178 2. A financial statement, on forms prescribed by the Board, that discloses the costs of administration,

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179 instruction, and other spending categories for the school and that has been concisely and clearly written 180 to enable the Board of Education and the public to compare such costs with those of other schools or 181 comparable organizations.

182 B. The Board of Education may revoke a contract if the college partnership laboratory school does 183 any of the following or otherwise fails to comply with the provisions of this chapter:

184 1. Commits a material and substantial violation of any of the terms, conditions, standards, or 185 procedures required under this chapter or the contract;

186 2. Fails to meet or make sufficient progress toward the performance expectations set forth in the 187 contract;

188 3. Fails to meet generally accepted standards of fiscal management; or

189 4. Substantially violates any material provision of law from which the college partnership laboratory 190 school was not exempted.

191 C. If the Board of Education revokes or does not renew a college partnership laboratory school 192 contract, it shall clearly state, in a resolution, the reasons for the revocation or nonrenewal.

193 § 23-299.8. Employment of professional, licensed personnel.

194 A. College partnership laboratory school personnel shall be employees of the institution of higher 195 education establishing the school.

196 B. Teachers working in a college partnership laboratory school shall hold a license issued by the 197 Board of Education or, in the case of an instructor in the higher education institution's Board-approved 198 teacher education program, be eligible to hold a Virginia teaching license. Teachers working in a 199 college partnership laboratory school shall be subject to the requirements of §§ 22.1-296.1 and 200 22.1-296.2 applicable to teachers employed by a local school board.

201 C. Professional, licensed personnel of a college partnership laboratory school shall be granted the 202 same employment benefits given to professional, licensed personnel in public schools in accordance with 203 the agreement between the college partnership laboratory school and the Board of Education. 204

§ 23-299.9. Funding of college partnership laboratory schools.

205 A. Each college partnership laboratory school shall receive such funds as may be appropriated by 206 the General Assembly in accordance with the appropriation act.

207 B. The governing board of a college partnership laboratory school is authorized to accept gifts, 208 donations, or grants of any kind and to spend such funds in accordance with the conditions prescribed 209 by the donor. However, no gift, donation, or grant shall be accepted by the governing board of a 210 college partnership laboratory school if the conditions for such funds are contrary to law or the terms 211 of the agreement between the Board of Education and the college partnership laboratory school.

212 C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the proportionate share of state and federal resources 213 allocated for students with disabilities and school personnel assigned to special education programs 214 shall be directed to college partnership laboratory schools enrolling such students. The proportionate share of moneys allocated under other federal or state categorical aid programs shall be directed to 215 216 college partnership laboratory schools serving students eligible for such aid.

217 D. College partnership laboratory schools shall be eligible to apply for and receive any federal or 218 state funds otherwise allocated for college partnership laboratory schools in the Commonwealth.

219 E. Any educational and related fees collected from students enrolled at a college partnership 220 laboratory school shall comply with Board of Education regulations and shall be credited to the account 221 of such school.

222 F. Each college partnership laboratory school shall be eligible to apply for and receive available 223 funds from the College Partnership Laboratory School Fund and the establishing institution of higher 224 education. 225

§ 23-299.10. Immunity.

226 A college partnership laboratory school shall be immune from liability to the same extent as the 227 public institution of higher education that established the school, and the employees and volunteers in a 228 college partnership laboratory school are immune from liability to the same extent as the employees of 229 the establishing institution of higher education.
