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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 46.2-1078.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-1078.1. Use of handheld personal communications devices in certain motor vehicles;
13	exceptions; penalty.
14	A. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a moving motor vehicle, <i>bicycle</i> , <i>electric personal</i>
15	assistive mobility device, electric power-assisted bicycle, or moped on the highways in the
16	Commonwealth while using any handheld personal communications device to:
17	1. Manually enter multiple letters or text in the device as a means of communicating with another
18	person; or
19	2. Read any email or text message transmitted to the device or stored within the device, provided
20	that this prohibition shall not apply to any name or number stored in the device nor to any caller

22	B. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:
$\overline{23}$	1. The operator of any emergency vehicle;
23 24	2. An operator who is lawfully parked or stopped;
25	3. The use of factory-installed or aftermarket global positioning systems (GPS) or wireless
2 6	communications devices used to transmit or receive data as part of a digital dispatch system; Θ
27	4. Any person using a handheld personal communications device to report an emergency; or
28	5. The use of two-way radio devices.
29	C. No citation for a violation of this section shall be issued unless the officer issuing such citation
3 0	has cause to stop or arrest the driver of such motor vehicle for the violation of some other provision of
31	this Code or local ordinance relating to the operation, ownership, or maintenance of a motor vehicle or
32	any criminal statute.
33	D. A violation of any provision of this section shall constitute a traffic infraction punishable, for a
34	first offense, by a fine of \$20 and, for a second or subsequent offense, by a fine of \$50.
35	For the purposes of this section, "emergency vehicle" means:
36	1. Any law-enforcement vehicle operated by or under the direction of a federal, state, or local
37	law-enforcement officer while engaged in the performance of official duties;
38	2. Any regional detention center vehicle operated by or under the direction of a correctional officer
39	responding to an emergency call or operating in an emergency situation;
40	3. Any vehicle used to fight fire, including publicly owned state forest warden vehicles, when
41	traveling in response to a fire alarm or emergency call;
42	4. Any ambulance, rescue, or life-saving vehicle designed or used for the principal purpose of
43	supplying resuscitation or emergency relief where human life is endangered;
44	5. Any Department of Emergency Management vehicle or Office of Emergency Medical Services
45	vehicle, when responding to an emergency call or operating in an emergency situation;
46	6. Any Department of Corrections vehicle designated by the Director of the Department of
47	Corrections, when (i) responding to an emergency call at a correctional facility, (ii) participating in a
48	drug-related investigation, (iii) pursuing escapees from a correctional facility, or (iv) responding to a
49	request for assistance from a law-enforcement officer; and
50	7. Any vehicle authorized to be equipped with alternating, blinking, or flashing red or red and white
51	secondary warning lights pursuant to § 46.2-1029.2.

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
