14	A. The driver of any motor vehicle, upon approaching a stationary emergency vehicle, as defined in
15 16	§ 46.2-920, that is displaying a flashing, blinking, or alternating emergency blue, red, or amber light or lights as provided in §§ 46.2-1022, 46.2-1023, and or 46.2-1024, or subdivision A 1 or A 2 of
17	§ 46.2-1025, shall (i) on a highway having at least four lanes, at least two of which are intended for
18 19	traffic proceeding as the approaching vehicle, proceed with caution and, if reasonable, with due regard for safety and traffic conditions, yield the right-of-way by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent
20	to the stationary emergency vehicle or (ii) if changing lanes would be unreasonable or unsafe, proceed
21	with due caution and maintain a safe speed for highway conditions.
22 23	B. Violation A violation of any provision of this section is punishable as a traffic infraction. A second or subsequent violation of any provision of this section shall constitute is punishable as a Class
24	1 misdemeanor.
25	C. If the violation resulted in damage to property of another person, the court may, in addition, order
26	the suspension of the driver's privilege to operate a motor vehicle for not more than one year. If the
27	violation resulted in injury to another person, the court may, in addition to any other penalty imposed,
28 29	order the suspension of the driver's privilege to operate a motor vehicle for not more than two years. If the violation resulted in the death of another person, the court may, in addition to any other penalty
3 0	imposed, order the suspension of the driver's privilege to operate a motor vehicle for two years.

D. The provisions of this section shall not apply in highway work zones as defined in § 46.2-878.1.
