9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 15.2-1747 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 15.2-1747. Creation of academies.
12	A. The governing bodies of two or more localities or other political subdivisions or other public
13	bodies hereinafter collectively referred to as "governmental units," may by ordinance or resolution enter
14	into an agreement which creates a regional criminal justice training academy under an appropriate name
15	and title containing the words "criminal justice training academy" [ or "criminal justice training
16	academy"] which shall be a public body politic and corporate. Any regional criminal justice training
17	academy created under this article shall also be subject to the requirements of § 9.1-102.
18	B. The agreement shall set forth (i) the name of the academy, (ii) the governmental subdivision in
19	which its principal office shall be situated, (iii) the effective date of the organization of the academy and
20	the duration of the agreement, (iv) the composition of the board of directors of the academy which may
21	include representation of each locality, political subdivision or governmental entity party to the
22	agreement, the members of which shall be the governing body of the academy, (v) the method for
23	selection and the terms of office of the board of directors, (vi) the voting rights of the directors which
24	need not be equal, (vii) the procedure for amendment of the agreement, and (viii) such other matters as
25	the governmental units creating the academy deem appropriate. Sheriffs and members of the governing
26	bodies of the governmental units as well as other public officials or employees may be members of the
27	board of directors.
28	C. Any governmental unit not a party to an original agreement creating an academy under this
29	section or § 15.2-1300 may join the academy only by two-thirds vote of the board of directors of the
30	academy. The governing body of the governmental unit seeking to join the academy shall request
31	membership by resolution or ordinance. The board of directors shall provide for the addition of the
32	joining governmental unit to the academy and the number, terms of office, and voting rights of members
33	of the board of directors, if any, to be appointed by the joining governmental unit.
34	D. A governmental unit may withdraw from an academy created under this section or § 15.2-1300
35	only by two-thirds vote of the board of directors of the academy. The governing body of the
36	governmental unit seeking to withdraw from the academy shall signify its desire by resolution or
37	ordinance. The board of directors shall consider requests to withdraw in October 2001, and in October
38	of every fifth year thereafter. No requests to withdraw shall be considered at any other time, unless
39	agreed to unanimously. Any withdrawal approved by the board of directors shall be effective on June 30
40	of the following year. The board of directors shall provide for the conditions of withdrawal.
41	D1. The Division of Capitol Police may become a party to an agreement creating an academy or
42	may join an existing academy. The Chief of the Capitol Police is authorized to enter into such
43	agreement as necessary to join an academy. The chief or his designee may serve as a member of the
44	board of directors of such academy, and in accordance with the bylaws of the academy, may serve as a
45	member of the executive committee or other committee of the academy.
46	E. The chairman of the academy board shall serve as a member and as the chairman of an executive
47	committee. The composition of the remaining membership of the executive committee, the term of office
<b>48</b>	of its members and any alternate members, procedures for the conduct of its meetings, and any
49	limitations upon the general authority of the executive committee shall be established in the bylaws of
50	the academy. The bylaws shall also establish any other special standing committees, advisory, technical
50 51	or otherwise, as the board of directors shall deem desirable for the transaction of its affairs.
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
