10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 46.2-870 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-870. Maximum speed limits generally.
13	Except as otherwise provided in this article, the maximum speed limit shall be 55 miles per hour on
14	interstate highways or other limited access highways with divided roadways, nonlimited access highways
15	having four or more lanes, and all state primary highways.
16	The maximum speed limit on all other highways shall be 55 miles per hour if the vehicle is a
17	passenger motor vehicle, bus, pickup or panel truck, or a motorcycle, but 45 miles per hour on such
18	highways if the vehicle is a truck, tractor truck, or combination of vehicles designed to transport
19	property, or is a motor vehicle being used to tow a vehicle designed for self-propulsion, or a house
20	trailer.
21	Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, the maximum speed limit shall be 65 70
22	miles per hour where indicated by lawfully placed signs, erected subsequent to a traffic engineering
23	study and analysis of available and appropriate accident and law-enforcement data, on: (i) interstate
24	highways, (ii) multilane, divided, limited access highways, and (iii) high-occupancy vehicle lanes if such
25	lanes are physically separated from regular travel lanes. The maximum speed limit on Interstate Route
26	85 shall be 70 miles per hour where indicated by lawfully placed signs, erected subsequent to a traffic and analysis of available and appropriate accident and law appropriate accident.
