10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-422 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 18.2-422. Prohibition of wearing of masks in certain places; exceptions.
13	It shall be unlawful for any person over sixteen years of age while wearing any mask, hood or other
14	device whereby a substantial portion of the face is hidden or covered so as to conceal the identity of the
15	wearer, to be or appear in any public place, or upon any private property in this Commonwealth without
16	first having obtained from the owner or tenant thereof consent to do so in writing. However, the
17	provisions of this section shall not apply to persons (i) wearing traditional holiday costumes; (ii)
18	engaged in professions, trades, employment or other activities and wearing protective masks which are
19	deemed necessary for the physical safety of the wearer or other persons; (iii) engaged in any bona fide
20	theatrical production or masquerade ball; or (iv) wearing a mask, hood or other device for bona fide
21	medical reasons upon $(a)$ the advice of a licensed physician or osteopath and carrying on his person an affidavit from the physician or esteopath angeifying the medical processity for vacating the device and the
22	affidavit from the physician or osteopath specifying the medical necessity for wearing the device and the
23 24	date on which the wearing of the device will no longer be necessary and providing a brief description of the device, or $(h)$ the device of a director of a director of state of americanal by the Covernor in response to a
24 25	the device, or (b) the declaration of a disaster or state of emergency by the Governor in response to a public health emergency where the emergency declaration expressly waives this section and provides for

26 the duration of the waiver. The violation of any provisions of this section shall constitute a Class 6
27 felony.
