WHEREAS, Harold Brown was reactivated in 2003 and was serving in the Khost province of Afghanistan when a suicide bomber detonated an explosive vest that killed Brown and six colleagues; and

WHEREAS, a man of determination and energy, Harold Brown lived his too brief life to the fullest, bringing joy to his family and friends and serving his country with great honor and resolve; and

WHEREAS, Harold Brown will be greatly missed by his young family, including his wife, Janet; children, Paul, Lena, and Claire; his parents, Barbara and Harold Brown, Sr.; and many other loving family members, friends, and colleagues; and

WHEREAS, Harold Brown's death is a reminder of the perils faced daily by the thousands of Americans who serve in our armed forces overseas and whose devotion to duty places them in harm's way; now, therefore, be it
