WHEREAS, Judy Walker has also worked to provide local schools with educational music programs, as well as productions for the entertainment of children such as Noye's Fludde, which allowed local schoolchildren to participate in the production; and

WHEREAS, Judy Walker generously gives of her time and talents in the community as a member of the Charlottesville Regional Tourism Council; board member of the Piedmont Council for the Arts, who honored her with an Individual Award for her contributions to the arts; and member of the Odyssey and the Contemporary Club; and

WHEREAS, Judy Walker has worked for over two decades to expand the Ash Lawn Opera Festival, allowing top producers to showcase their talents and enriching the lives of community supporters; now, therefore, be it
